Many members of the tour expressed surprise at the great variety of historical architecture found in the borough.

Maynard, 52, started playing the trumpet at age 14 and has been playing professionally for most of his life. He attracts a large number of followers from all different age groups because of his feel for change. He started out playing only jazz, but he now blends the jazz with all the elements of
