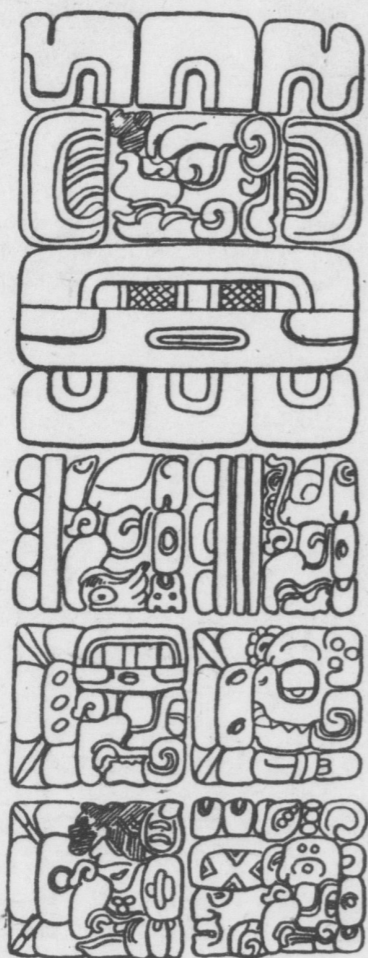

Speaking to the group was Harold Bowers, a representative of the American Cancer Society.

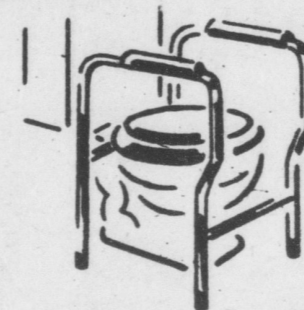
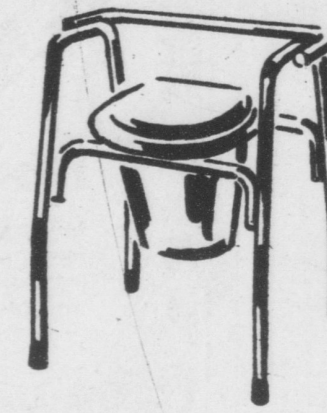
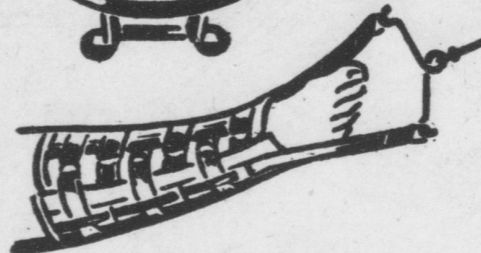
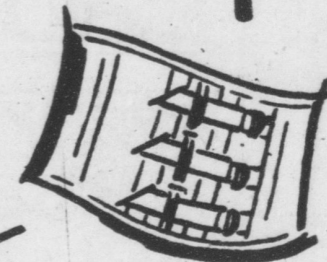
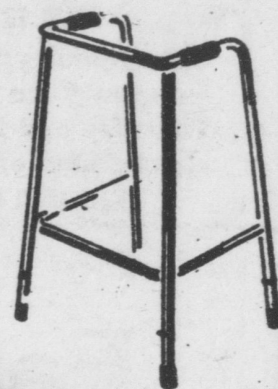
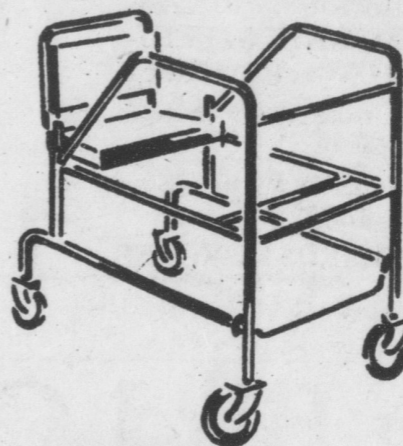
Mr. Bowers, who has a laryngotomy, discussed smoking and its effects on the human body.
