Dear Mr. Khomeini,

The phase of moon that was beginning when I last wrote you has now come to completion. Tonight the moon is full, a magnificent sight to behold. The writer describes you as "hard, scheming, brutal and uncompromising, acting not as a dedicated man of God who believes and lives by the gold rule, but as a conscienceless cuttthroat." Obviously you are not losing any sleep over the American view of you, and certainly this could be a biased statement, but if only one person thought that of me it would give cause for a close self-inspection. What say you to that, Mr. Khomeini? Are you so in tune with Allah that even He would look the other way while you continue to desecrate His creation? Or have you lost touch with Him altogether?

You can depend on it, Mr. Khomeini, your day of reckoning is fast approaching. You will discover soon enough that you can push this country just so far. Your on-again, off-again release of our people has fractured the emotions of many of us, but we still have hope and we believe that our government will work out a solution to your evil scheming. Had you been dealing with people like yourself, you would have been blown away long ago. Consider yourself lucky that we are not like you. You are your own worst enemy as well as that of Iran. You have led your country to the brink of destruction.

Even so, one can always change, and we are ever hopeful that such a change will soon take place with you. Despite what you have done to our people we are still the best friend you have, maybe the only one, and that is because we are big enough to forgive. There is encouraging news that our people are about to be

freed. Think twice about how you plan to release them, Mr. Khomeini. Think twice also about having any public trials and holding


some of them back. We will settle for nothing less than total, unconditional release of every one of them, together. Grab this chance.
