The death was called accidental by Dr. Whitlaw M. Show, Lancaster County coroner, who investigated the accident with Mount Joy Borough police.

Scott was in his room when he became caught in some clothing. A belt was found tightly wrapped around his neck and appeared to be the reason his

oxygen supply was cut off, said police.

Scott was born in Lancaster, the son of Steven M. and Arlene R. Arnold Kaylor.

He was in the sixth grade at Seiler Elementary School, Mount Joy, and attended Sunday School at Trinity Lutheran Church, Mount Joy.
