Karla Rex, daughter of Charles and Eunice Rex, R.D.#1, Box 218B, Columbia, has received an academic scholarship from Messiah College.

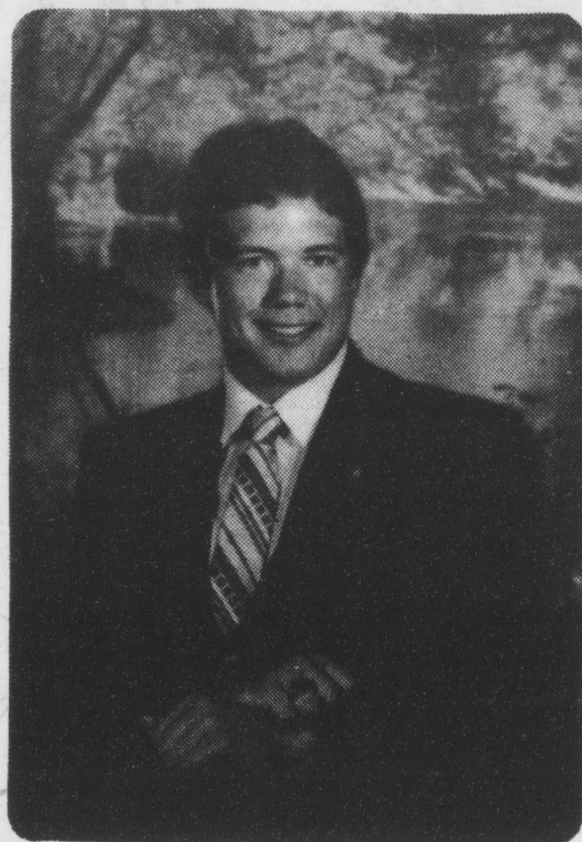
The college awards academic scholarships to students who have distinguished themselves in the classroom.
