## Flea Market Finds

### Domino clock value: \$265



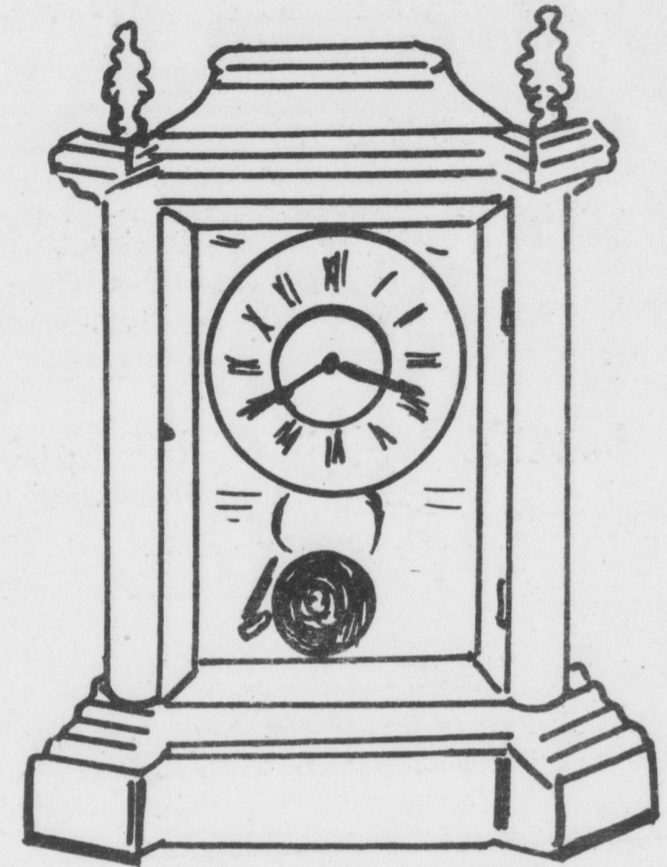

Q. Can you date our Domino clock from the Ingraham firm?—Mr. G. T., Hayward, Calif.

A. Treasured indeed are the various timepieces ascribed to the E. Ingraham and Co., of Bristol, Conn. Mantels of the late Victorian period held a host of their coveted clocks. The rather dramatic Domino shelf clock, having a black painted wooden case, was introduced in 1886. Black clocks were the rage of the 1880s! This model had a brass eight-day spring driven movement with strike. According to company catalogs it was discontinued by 1892. What was its original selling price? A modest \$11! Value guide: Domino shelf clock, \$265.

Q. At a yard sale I purchased a marigold water pitcher in Carnival glass having a windmill decor. Who made this pattern?—May, Lebanon, Pa.

A. Chalk up this fortunate find to the Imperial Glass Co., of Ohio. In the early 1900s they joined such fellow makers as Northwood, Fenton and Millersburg in producing quantities of iridescent glass. Finding pieces of the firm's Windmill design can keep collectors spinning regardless of color. Beginning collectors please note: this pattern has been extensively reproduced, so buyer beware! Value guide: Windmill water pitcher, marigold, \$50.



DOMINO SHELF CLOCK

Q. Would my piece of sheet music "The Road Is Open Again," picturing Franklin D. Roosevelt and Dick Powell be worth preserving?—Mabel, Macom, Mo.

A. Numerous presidents have been honored by American songwriters, often for inaugural or campaign events. Due to his length of time in office and wartime patriotism Franklin D. Roosevelt proved to be a popular subject with publishers. "The Road Is Open Again" was performed by Dick Powell, who is pictured on the cover along with the president, in a propaganda short subject for the National Reconstruction Administration. Locating this song sheet in the attic trunk along with your old hair nets and war ration books means you're \$15 wealthier!
