Wood Stove Maintenance

Each year more people are relying on wood burning stoves to keep their homes warm during the cold winter months. And according to the Insurance Federation of Pennsylvania, each year an increasing number of fires have occurred simply because homeowners have failed to maintain them. To prevent a potential tragedy, here are a few practical tips on proper care of your wood burning stove.

Make sure that your stove and stove pipe are cleared of creosote. This oily substance builds up as a result of incomplete combustion in the stove. Instead of burning off, creosote passes into the chimney where a spark can easily ignite it. During the cool Spring days, many homeowners let the fire in their wood burning stoves smoulder for long periods of time. And since smouldering fires mean incomplete combustion, creosote builds up. The solution ... try quick, hot fires. In this way you'll get the heat you need without creosote. Spring is also an excellent time to repair and clean your wood burning stove. Be certain to check for cracks in the stove, loose hinges, broken legs or grates, or worn out draft louvers. So that your stove is ready for next winter's operation, order replacement parts now. If you wait until next fall, the cold weather may arrive before the missing part.

Proper maintenance also requires that you determine whether or not your stove pipe needs cleaning. To do this, simply tap the pipe hard with your fingernail. If you hear a thud, soot has built up in the pipe, and you should take the time to have it professionally cleaned. A dirty chimney is a fire hazard.

And whether your home has a wood burning stove or not, be sure to install smoke detectors.

The electric use profile plots each customer's average daily kilowatt-hour usage over the past 13 months in bar chart form. Additional information adjacent to the

bar chart compares the customer's average electrical usage between the current billing period and the same period one year ago. Since extremely cold or

mild weather may affect energy usage, the average daily temperature for both the current period and the period a year ago is supplied.

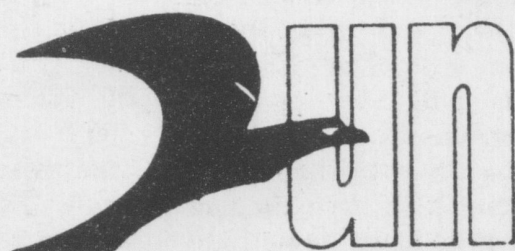
