

# Musical celebrations at Trinity Lutheran

Music will announce the Christmas celebrations in the worship services of Trinity Lutheran Church of Mount Joy in three services.

Under the direction of Dr. Leona Frances Woskowiak, the Senior Choir will present a special Moravian Christmas Cantata on Sunday, December 21, at the 10:45 am service. Christian Gregor's "The Prince of Peace is Come" will include solos by choir members Dottie Heilig, Donald D. Drenner, and Samuel Har-

nich. This Cantata was written for the Christmas Eve Lovefeast of the Moravian Church in 1760. The 10:45 service will include two preludes: "Chorale Partita: 'From Heaven Above to Earth I Come'" by Paul Manz and "Chorale Prelude: 'O Come, O Come, Emmanuel'" by Leona-Frances Woskowiak. The Bach-Gounod "Ave Maria" follows the Cantata as the offertory. The Senior Choir will sing Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus" from The

Messiah as the recessional hymn. The service will conclude with the exciting "Toccata on: 'Joy to the World'" by the Director of Music.

There will be two Christmas Eve services: a Family Candlelight Service at 7:00 and a Candlelight Communion Service at 11:00. The 7:00 service will include two preludes written by Trinity's Director of Music, Dr. Woskowiak, and dedicated to her parents, Charles and Helen Woskowiak: "The Joy of Christmas," which is based on themes from Polish Christmas hymns and carols, and "Christmas Peace, Christmas Love" in which the English chimes are featured on the organ. The Cherub Choir will sing Jack Coleman's "The Cat and The Mouse in the Stabel of Bethlehem" and "Oh Come, Little Children" by J.P. Schulte. The postlude will be Dr. Woskowiak's "Fanfare and Toccata: 'Angels We Have Heard on High.'" Throughout the service, the congregation

will join in singing eight Christmas hymns to celebrate in music the birth of Christ.

Following the Family Candlelight Service, Dr. Woskowiak will play original arrangements of carols and Christmas hymns on the outdoor Carillon at 9:00. She will present a Christmas organ recital at 10:15 pm. Musical selections include: "Concert-Overture and the 'Chorale Alleluia'" from J.S. Bach's Christmas Cantata *Unto Us a Child is Born* and "Sheep May Safely Graze" from his *Birthday Cantata*, George F. Handel's "Joy to the World" and "Hallelujah Chorus," Paul Manz's "Go Tell it on the Mountain" and "Still, Still, Stil," "Noel I: Noel Grand Choeur 'Laissez paître vos betes'" and "Noel II: Varies 'Laissez paître vos betes'" by Jean-Jaques Beauvarlet-Charpentier, Mandelssohn's "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" and "Caroling, Caroling" by Alfred Burt.

At the 11:00 Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Service, Trinity's Senior Choir will sing the prelude "O Jesu Sweet" by Samuel Scheidt. The second prelude will be the soprano solo, "Holy Child of Bethlehem," written by Dr. Woskowiak and dedicated to Rev. David E. Klepper, Jr., pastor of the church, and sung by Senior Choir member Dottie Heilig. The Senior Choir will also sing Alfred Burt's "The Star Carol" as their anthem. For the offertory, Dr. Woskowiak has arranged Kirkpatrick's "Cradle Song" as a duet and it will be sung by Dottie Heilig and Donald D. Drenner. The benediction for the Candlelight Communion Service will be a chorale composition by Dr. Woskowiak, "Let Us Live in Peace." The service will conclude with her "Meditation on 'Silent Night.'"

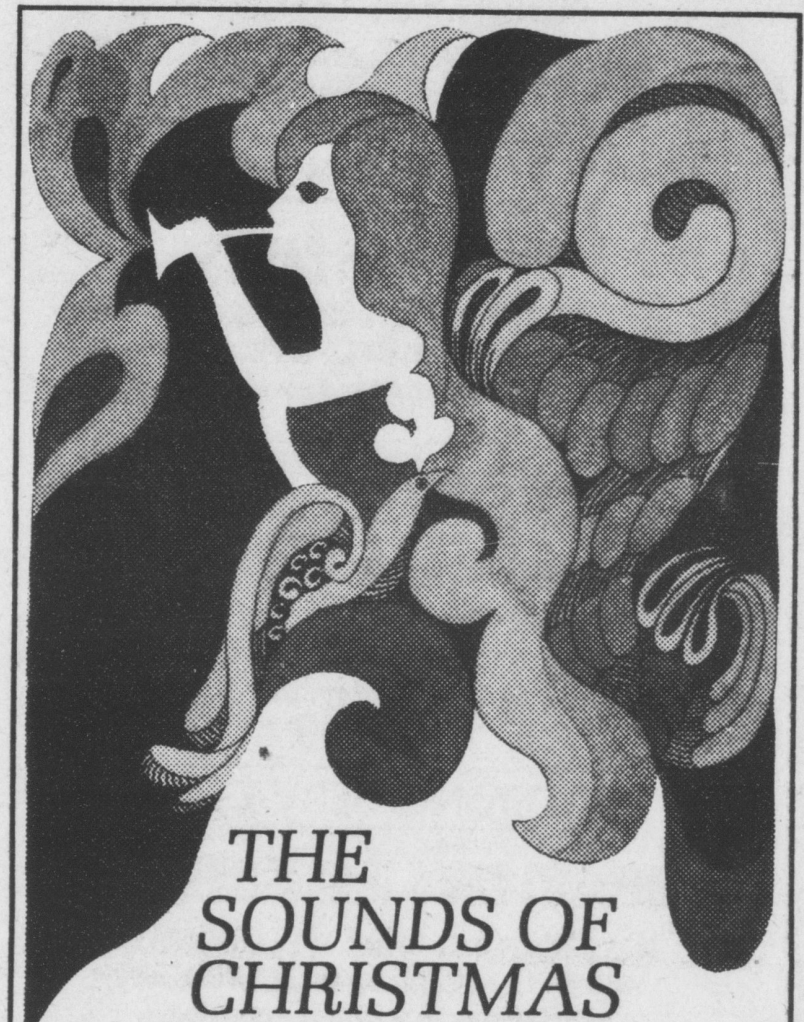
