## Platform rockers

**Q. Is the Eastlake style platform rocker we purchased at a local market regarded as a flea market favorite?—Mr. and Mrs. G. D., Highland, Ill.**

**A. When the platform rocker rocked onto the scene in the 1870s, it practically revolutionized the chair industry. It represented a distinct departure from earlier styles as the base remained stationary while the chair rocked on its spring-type mechanism. Thus even repeated rocking failed to wear out a carpet. Because Eastlake-style furniture was the rage of the moment, many rockers surrendered to prevailing details. These comfortable chairs are as dearly loved today as they were a century ago! Value guide: platform rocker, Eastlake details, walnut, 1880s, \$350.**

**Q. Would it be possible to furnish me with a price list on advertising thermometers?—Ronald, Mobile, Al.**

**A. Regardless of weather conditions, prices on store thermometers are rising to ever higher levels: Carter's Ink, porcelain, 27 inches tall, \$55; Kentucky Club Tobacco, 36 inches tall, \$45; Old Dutch Root Beer, two windmills, 26 inches tall, \$35.**

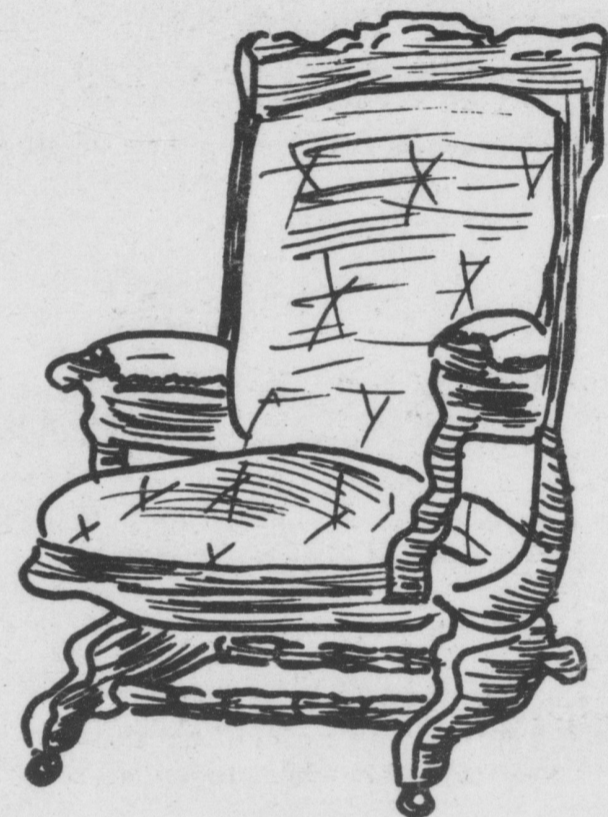

**A. Charles Ahrenfeldt (1807-1893)** operated a decorating studio in the Limoges district of France in the 1880s. By the early 1890s, he was engaged in producing porcelain presentations. Upon his demise the business was conducted by his son Charles J. Ahrenfeldt. American wholesale agents found an immediate market for their handsomely ornamented china, which resulted in the Ahrenfeldt's opening a second factory in Carlsbad-Altrohau. Porcelains bearing the initials or name of this prestigious potter are rapidly vanishing into ceramic collections! Value guide: dresser tray, roses, circa 1895, \$35.



EASTLAKE PLATFORM ROCKER

**Q. When were pickle castors popular? We have one in a blue glass daisy and button pattern, housed in an ornate frame.—Mrs. K. P., Albany, N. Y.**

**A. The lowly pickle was elevated to a position of prominence during the 1890s, when pickle castors suddenly popped onto tabletops. The glass jars holding the pickles were made of clear, colored and opaque glass of every description. Those designed in the daisy and button pattern are prized. The metal frames, often of silverplate or Britannia metal, has a base and handles rising above the jar generally in an arched shaped effect. A pair of tongs to procure the pickle from the jar could be found hanging from the metal frame! Value guide: daisy and button pattern blue glass jar, ornate silverplated frame, 1900, \$265.**
