

A MENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION APROPOSED TO THE CITIZENS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH FØR THEIR APPRO-VAL OR REJECTION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, PUBLISHED BY ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH, IN PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE XVIII, OF THE CONSTITUTION A LOUT PESOLUTION

A JOINT RESOLUTION Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Common-wealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accor-dance with the eighteenth article thereof: Amendment.




