

TELEPHONE AS WINE-TESTER.

Electric Current Put to a New Use in Wine-Adulterations Made to Talk.

One hears of wonderful new applications or uses for the electric current—some of real value, others nonsensical. "ut probably one of the latest is the testing of wine by means of the telephone. According to the Paris correspondent of a London daily paper, a M. Maneuvrier, director of the laboratory of researches of the Paris Faculty of Sciences, has discovered an infallible method of ascertaining by means of the telephone how much a given quantity of wine has been watered. The principle on which the invention rests is the variable conductivity of different liquids, notably wine and water. The originality of M. Maneuvrier's ingenious application is his use of the telephone to determine to what degree the liquid under observation is a conductor.

He has constructed an apparatus, the details of which are not given, which is said to achieve this object satisfactorily and accurately.

The apparatus works as follows: Two vessels, one containing wine known to be pure, and the other the same quantity of the wine to be tested, are placed on an instrument outwardly resembling a pair of scales. The telephone is in contact with both liquids. If the sample of wine under observation is as pure as the standard used for comparison no sound is heard; if, on the contrary, it contains water, the tell-tale telephone "speaks," and the greater the proportion of water, the louder the instrument complains.

HOW JAPS PLAY KEN.

Old Game Gives Belles of Far East Opportunity to Display Their Beautiful Hands.

In its most widely practiced form the basis of the Japanese game of ken is that the fully outstretched hand of the player, the fully closed hand, a stone, and two fingers alone extended, the rest being closed, scissors. Each of the players, says the Japan Mail, counting one, two, three, throws out his hand, at the moment of pronouncing three, and the out whose manual symbol is superior to that of the others, according to the theory of the game, was the trial.

Superiority is determined on the hypothesis that whereas scissors cannot cut a stone, they can cut paper, and whereas paper is cut by scissors, it can wrap a stone. Consequently scissors is inferior to stone, but conquers paper; stone is inferior to paper, but conquers scissors, and paper is inferior to scissors but conquers stone. There are innumerable varieties of the game—for it is not a mere method of determining a dispute of priority—and they are constantly aided to by ingenious young ladies, the dancing-girl class especially, who play it with exquisite grace and judicious enhancement of beautiful hands and arms.

Rabbits, which have been the pest of Australia and New Zealand for many years, have now become a source of large revenue. Frozen rabbits to the value of over \$800,000 were exported from Victoria, New Zealand, last year, in addition to \$700,000 worth of preserved rabbits. This business is daily increasing. Now that the trapping industry is such an important one, employing as it does several thousand hands, and is largely effective in keeping the rabbit pest in check, the chances are that the methods of compulsory suppression now enforced on landholders will at least be moderated by the government.

The rabbits in Australia and New Zealand were originally shipped from England, and it is almost impossible to keep them out of the cattle ranches. Fences have been built around these vast stations with a wire netting sunk 18 inches below the surface to prevent the rabbits from getting inside, but as soon as grass becomes short on the outside, "Mr. Bunnie" will burrow under the wire netting and eat up the grass on the inside.

Rabbits in this country rarely burrow, but are to be found in stumps of trees and under fallen timber. In and about Chicago, where land is divided for building purposes, rabbits make their homes under the sidewalk, and can be easily lured out by a good dog. Such, however, is not the habit of the Australian pest.

Reappearance in Battle Drives Away Small Fish—Fishes Like Change of Scene.

As is well known, fish like a change of home, and frequently, without apparent reason, abandon waters in which they have long resided, and are next found in some distant part of the sea. A desire for a change of scene, however, is not the cause of the pilchard suddenly leaving the west coast of France, and the fishermen are unable to discover the reason.

Now it is announced, according to the testimony of fishermen, that the shark has returned to European waters. In the Baltic, where sharks had been extinct since 1759, they have made their reappearance in considerable numbers, and several fishing boats report having whole catches of fish devoured from the nets, which were broken, in the Belt and the Cattegat. A fisherman who fell overboard narrowly escaped with his life. Shoals of sharks, some of them of large size, have been seen off the German coast, and they are even reported as becoming far from rare in the North sea. Their presence is attributed to their pursuit of the herring shoals on the west coast of Norway.

British Mammas. In his "British Mammas," Sir Harry Johnson's new book, that writer says that man "is the commonest mammal in our islands at the present day, with the doubtful exception of the long-tailed pig mouse; and excepting the common mouse, the brown and the black rat, man is probably the most recently arrived mammal in the British Islands."

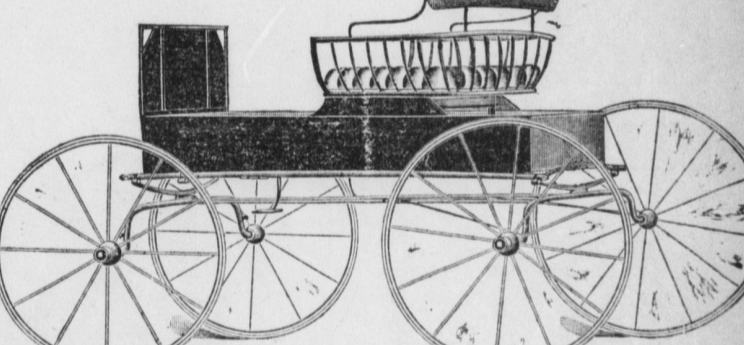
