Since then oue of my friends suffered a sprain and consented to have a leaf tobacco poultice applied, which resulted in his case just as it did in mine. I have also tried it in other instances of slight injury, where there was pain and danger of swelling, and have found that invariably it relieved the pain within a remarkably short space of time, and generally prevented any swelling. 
