DEATH RATE OF INFANTS.

It Is Increasing in Spite of the Best Efforts of Modern Science.

In spite of the increase in the Pasterurization of milk, in spite of the rac that in some circles of society there is a growing knowledge about the care of infants, the death rate of those under wo years all over the country, says the Philadelphia Inquirer, is so large as to cause great alarm. One of the most eminent specialists announces:

"If 100 mothers of sound health would agree to submit the entire care of their infants to one direction I warrant that not one of the children would, if properly brought into the world, die of summer disease."

This is an astonishing statement, but It can be practically verified by nearly every practitioner whose experience with the children has been large. It seems strange that though the human race is thousands of years old, there is so little knowledge on the part of mothers as to the proper care of infants. It is because every mother depends on herself, her instincts or the poor experience of others to help her children through se daita arsht der ahrma. drackerei days physicians are doing their best to the critical portion of the year. Wherever there is intelligent care taken of children and wise supervision is exercised there is no more fear of dysentery in the summer time than there is of smallpox. Yet many thousands of children die every summer because of neglect. There is no mother to this city so poor that she cannot send postal card to the board of health for its instructions on the subject and to follow them out only costs less than the ordinary practice, but is sure to reult in benefit to the infant. The difficulty in impressing mothers is the fact that they assert that they know more about children than any doctor who ever lived and insist upon



Bank to Be Erected on Site of Burial Place of the Martyred President's Ancesters.

In an abandoned graveyard in the heart of Worcester village, in New York, are the graves of the grandparents and the great-grandparents of the late President Garfield. Worcester was the old Garfield home. Abram Garfield, the father of the president, left the place for Ohio at 12 years of age. Three generations of the family lived there. Solomon Garfield, the great-grandfather, settled in Worcester in 1766. Thomas Garfield, the grandfather, was born in Worcester in 1775, and lived his whole life there.

After a bitter fight a bank has sesured the right from the town to build a new banking house on the old cemetery property. The excavation has been made and the foundations are in course of construction. The burying ground covered a quarter of an acre, and it was not known just where the graves of the martyred president's ancestors were located. When the Garfield family was appealed to they de-cided to leave the matter to the citi-
