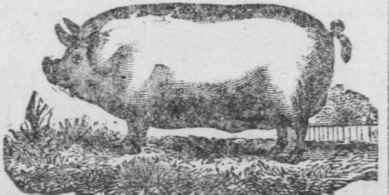

failure to come at the proper time, and not

panied by the assessor of the district in
