### Farmers' Column

VALUABLE INFORMATION FOR OUR SUBURBAN FRIENDS

The Apple the Most Profitable Fruit. How to Burn up Stumps-Butter Fat Pays in Winter-The use of Chemical Fertilizers—Notes

A simple rule for the arrangement of dooryard trees and shrubs is never o set them in straight lines, but in groups with curvig boundaries.

An ideal peach orchard location is high, rolling elevation where the very best air drainage is obtainable, and if the land slopes toward the orthwest so much the better. Never et peach trees in a hollow.

Rough, stormy weather should be utilized in preparing the frames and n replacing broken glass in the hoted and cold frame sash. It is desirable to paint sash at least every other year.

Crop rotation will greatly assist you in building up the soil and in providing feed for your animals. You cannot expect that your yield will be satisfactory if you grow the same crop successively a number of years on the same land. Try a rotation in which legumes have a pro-

Dust is one of the great road probems. Its presence means wear and tear and disease. Applicants of R. F. D. No. 3. tar not only keep it down and pre vent it, but tar is a disinfectant. I kills the germs, and a tarred road will certainly make for health.

How about building an icehouse now? It will not cost a whole lot of money or time to do it, and the result will add a new comfort and oleasure in farm life as well as a profit making proposition for the care of milk and other perishable farm products.

Do not forget that type is more to be considered in buying dairy cows than breed. There are good animals and poor animals in all breeds, and the number of poor animals available isually predominates. Most poor nimals are for sale because the ownr does not want them.

There is one thing which all farmers who use chemicals should remem-These conditions should be spread as evenly as possible. They are all concentrated and will burn or injure vegetation if they are dumped in handfuls upon growing crops They should be spread out all over the ground.

Butter fat is in greatest demand during the winter. The prices are best in winter. The farmer can make the most money by producing t in winter provided he has the ight kind of a cow, given the right eare and proper feed. Where the nost money is made in dairying there ou will find a community doing win er dairying.

In the early part of the winter bore two inch auger hole to a depth of about three inches in the top of each stump to be removed, fill the hole with refined nitrate of potash and a nin tight on it. Let it otash will be asbsorbed. Pour ittle oil on the top of the stump and The entire stump and in great many instances all the root vill be consumed by a slow burning

Considering the little attention it requires and the general hardiness of the fruit trees there i no reason why every farmer should not take a deep interest in their rais ng, particularly as they are so lav sh in their returns.

Apples grow in clay, sand, gravel, shale and in a mixture of all these provided the soil is deep, well drained and properly supplied with humus and that it is elevated somewhat above the immediately surrounding lands and slightly rolling to admit of air drainage.
