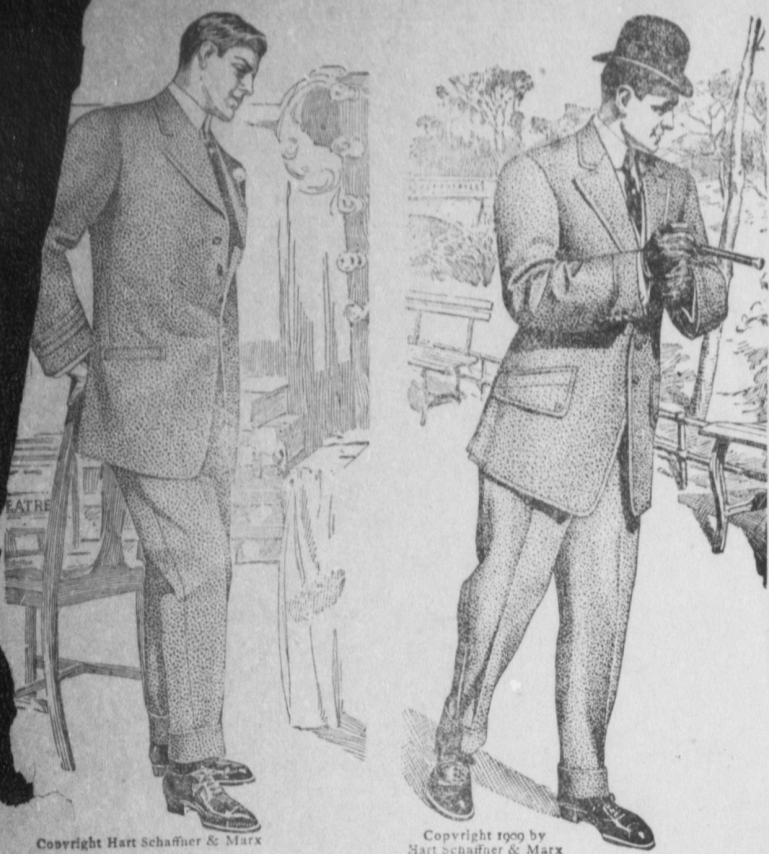

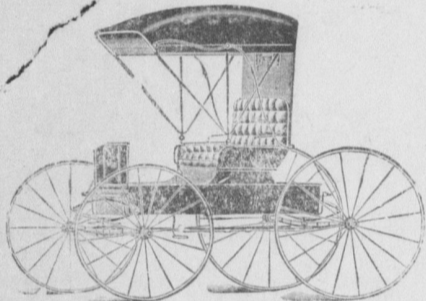

Miss Ruth Young, of Manheim, has quite a number of pupils here whom she is teaching music.

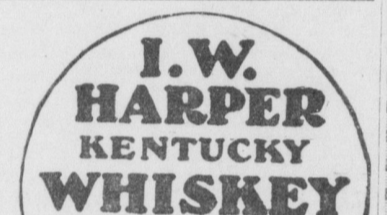
Mrs. Levi Fissel and son, Charles spent a few days with Milt Werner and wife, in Central Rapho.

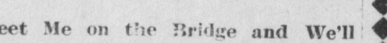
