

FOSTER IS KILLING YOUNG RABBITS

Unlawful to Permit Dogs to Pursue Game in Closed Season

Reports from the country about say that dogs are destroying the rabbits at such a rate that if it is not stopped will make them very scarce the coming season.

"Any dog, off land controlled by the owner of such dog, pursuing or following upon the track of any game quadruped, such as hare or rabbit and of any game bird or other wild bird, protected by existing law, during the closed season for such animal or bird in this Commonwealth, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance; and may be killed by the owner or lessee of land wherein it is found, or by any employee of such owner or lessee or by any game-protector, game warden, forestry-warden, or any other officer of the Commonwealth whose duty it is to protect the game of this State, when seen upon the track of such game or wild bird, unless such dog shall wear a collar having attached thereto a metallic tag or plate upon which shall be plainly inscribed in English the name and address of the owner of such dog; and any dog thus wearing a collar, inscribed as before mentioned, pursuing small game of land controlled by the owner of such dog, during what is known as the closed season for such game or wild birds, may be killed by the owner or lessee of any land upon which such dog may be found, or by any employee of either the owner or lessee, or by a game-protector, deputy game-protector, game warden, forestry warden, or any officer of the State whose duty it is to protect the game of the State, when such dog is seen upon the track of any such game, after notice in writing from that particularly person, or from the Secretary of the Game Commission has been given to the owner of such dog, to the effect that the dog in question is in the habit of destroying or pursuing upon the track of game or wild birds, contrary to the provisions of this section. Provided, that dogs, when accompanied by and under the control of their masters, may be trained upon any of the living wild game or birds of this State, excepting deer and fawn from the fifteenth day of August to the first day of January next following, so long as no injury is inflicted upon said animals or birds."

THAT'S SOME BOAT

Mr. John Engle of This Place, Aids in Its Construction

Mr. John Engle, son of Mr. D. H. Engle of this place, now at Detroit, Mich., writes us that he is employed with the company that just completed building the largest boat ever launched on the Great Lakes.

The launching of the mammoth steel bulk freighter Col. J. M. Schoonmaker at the Boerse yards of the Great Lakes Engineering Works Saturday morning will be an event on the great lakes, as the great vessel is 617 feet long, 10 feet longer than the largest boat now afloat on fresh water.

The new monarch of the lakes was produced by the Detroit builders for the Wm. P. Snyder shipping interests of Pittsburgh and is the first of two such vessels to be built. The other vessel will not come out before 1912. Both designed to carry ore and coal and will ship their cargoes at docks built especially for them.

The new steamer cost a trifle under \$500,000 and a feature of her construction is the luxurious fittings designed for the comfort of officers, crew and passengers. The forward quarters, for the use of officers and passengers, are especially fine. Accommodations unsurpassed by any hotel ashore have been made for 12 passengers, each compartment containing bathrooms, the finest furniture and homelike decorations.

The Schoonmaker's dimensions are: Length over all, 617 ft.; length of keel, 597 feet; beam, 64 feet; depth, 32 feet. Her capacity is 12,000 tons. Capt. Thomas H. Saunders, now master of the steamer Shenango, the first 600-foot boat on the lakes, will in all probability bring out the new leviathan. Miss Gretchen Schoonmaker, daughter of Col. J. M. Schoonmaker, for whom the vessel is named, will act as sponsor for the steamer at the launching.
