THE COUNTY FAIR

Big Fields of Horses—A Fine Exhibition and Large Midway Assured. There is no doubt of the big success of the Lancaster Fair, to be held on September 26th, 27th, 28, and 29th. It follows the Allentown fair and is just one week ahead of the one, at York, so that exhibitors horsemen and others can attend the three big fairs making easy jumps. Altho this is but the third year of the Lancaster Fair, it has jumped into popularity and need not take a back seat for any of the others. The exhibits of stock, machinery and farm products this year will be larger by far than ever before and the races are bound to bring a large number of excellent horses. It is a notable racing programme, with \$4,400 in purses. Speed Secretary James A. Miller has been around to all the race meetings and assures him that they are coming to Lancaster. There should be something doing in the 2:17 and 2:12 pacing races and 2:14 trot, besides that, free-for-all on Thursday, the big day of the week. There will be four days of harness racing, with running races each of the last three days. The entries for the races close on September 19th.

One of the great features of the fair will be the daily aeroplane flights. Charles J. Strobel, of Toledo, O., has arranged this part of the show and he will send to the city a young, but experienced aviator. His name is Howard Le Van and he is but 17 years old. He has been down in Porto Rico giving exhibitions for the government and will return after his work in the north to teach the army officers to navigate with aeroplanes. The lad has been successful at the big meets and has won a number of prizes for his graceful landings.

This year the fair will have a real midway, especially as it, was rather slim last year. J. F. Seidmridge, who has charge of the concessions, started early and visited Coney Island and other famous resorts. As a result he has no less than sixteen big shows booked, including California Frank's Wild West, which alone has 300 feet of space. Ferraris Animal Show, the diving girls, an alligator farm and numerous vaudeville shows. One interesting exhibit is the African Village with twenty-two cannibals, right from the heart of Africa, who live in huts, just as they do in their wild state. One funny animal to be seen on the "path" is the big monkey, owned by John Gornly, which dodges base balls thrown at him. Several gentlemen of Lancaster will have a baby show, which will be away from the midway. It will be a very nice attraction, in which children under one and two years will be seen to compete for cash prizes. The baby shows are more popular than ever and 250 competed at a recent New Jersey exhibition. By the time the fair opens every foot of space on the grounds will be sold. The Four Lukens, a noted team of aerial bar performers, will exhibit before the grand stand and will have three shows on the midway.
