Last Tollgate Last week the last tollgate and toll road in Baltimore county, Maryland, passed out of existence, and the event was celebrated with music, redfire and oratory. The Governor of the State was present, as well as the Mayor of the city; there was a procession of business men, and the old gate was ripped down and destroyed. Furthermore, it is proposed that the keeper's house shall be removed to Druid Hill Park and set up as a relic near the Maryland Building—Baltimore's souvenir of the Philadelphia Centennial of 1876. While to persons living at a distance these incidental details may appear to be trivial, nevertheless they serve to illustrate in striking fashion the popular revulsion against the private construction of roadways and the levy of tolls for their use. County and State have supplanted corporation capital in such enterprises and the freedom of the highway has come to be expected. We would gladly chronicle the disappearance of the last tollgate in Lancaster county, and we have no doubt that turnpikes would soon be free if our farmers and automobilists would get together and make an effort.

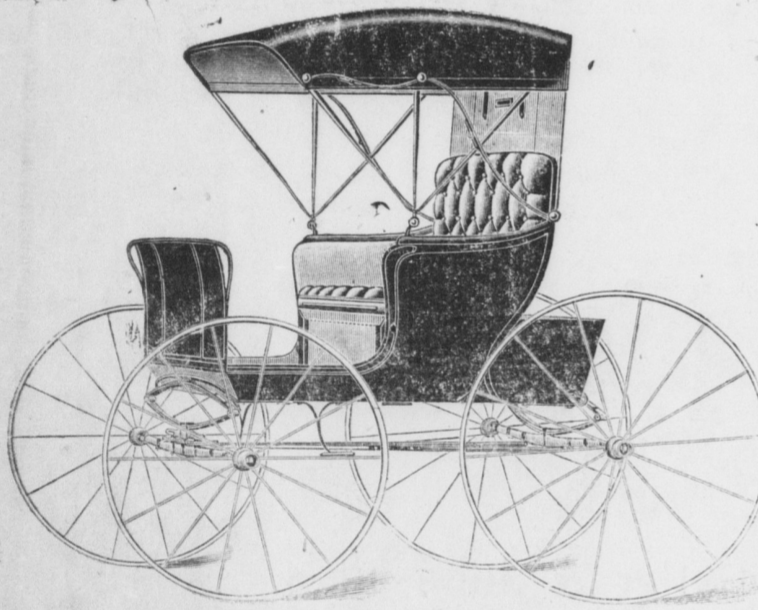

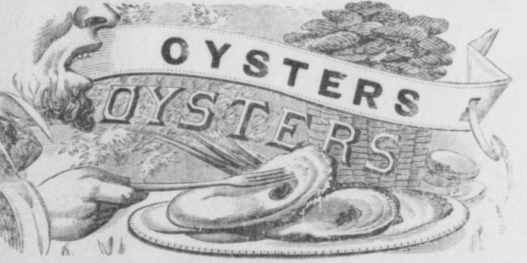
