WILL AWARD MEDALS

Interesting Affairs About The Lancaster Co. S. S. Association

You are no doubt aware of the fact that last year the Lancaster County Sabbath School Association was awarded a banner by the State Association, for having attained to the County Front Line position.

The following are the ten points of the "County Front Line Standard"—

- 1. County organized. 2. Annual Convention held. 3. Complete district organization in county. 4. Annual Convention or Institute held in each district. 5. Statistics gathered annually and sent to State office. 6. Pledge made to State Association and paid. 7. County represented at the State Convention. 8. Fifty per cent. of the schools have Cradle Roll Departments. 9. Thirty per cent. of the schools have Home Departments. 10. Twenty per cent. of the schools have Teacher Training Classes. A class must take one examination before it can be counted.

The State Sabbath School Association has suggested a higher goal to be attained by the Counties of Pennsylvania, because this is the Jubilee Year of that organization.

- 1. Front Line secured or maintained October 1, 1912. 2. Ten per cent. increase in total enrollment. 3. Thirty-three and one-third per cent. of the schools with Organized Adult Bible Classes holding Certificates of Recognition. 4. Organization of Secondary Division. 5. Fifty per cent. of the schools using Graded Lessons. 6. An aggressive Temperance Campaign.

(a) A Temperance Secretary or Committee in each school. (c) Pledges signed by at least fifty per cent. of the enrolled membership.

7. Greater intensity in Missionary Study. (a) A Missionary Secretary or Committee in each school. (b) At least ten minutes be given a month to Missionary education in each school.

(c) That all Teacher Training graduates who have not taken the Seal Course on Missions be requested to do so this year. 8. Every school in the county visited by a district officer.

9. Twenty per cent. of the schools contributing to the County Association. These points are set merely as a goal toward which to strive, since it is only by having high ideals that we can hope for material "Increase."

This Jubilee Year we want to do our best. Your best will inspire another's best. "If we can say we are doing our best, it will be heaven's best." The State Association has planned to award a bronze medal to the Sunday School worker in each county who has been engaged in actual service fifty years or more. This medal will be awarded at the State Convention which will be held at Philadelphia next October.

DECIDES ELECTION DISPUTE

Ruling of the East Donegal Township Election Officers Upheld

Judge Hassler handed down a decision in the election contest in East Donegal township over the office of road supervisor. The petition is dismissed at the cost of the petitioner. At the election of November 7, 1911, Roy S. Nissley and E. S. Weidman, the former a Republican and the latter a candidate on both the Keystone and Democratic tickets, ran for road supervisor. The returns showed 250 votes for Nissley and 249 for Weidman. A number of electors of the district contested the election of Nissley on the ground that one vote for Weidman in one district of the township and three in another were not counted. In one case the voter made only one mark, or half of an X, the court holds that, as the law requires a cross to be made, the election officers acted properly in rejecting these ballots.

MCCALL'S FERRY NEXT

The York Haven Power Company Must Remove Dam

Before August 1st, all that section of the great York Haven dam that extends between the eastern shore of the Susquehanna and Duffy's island—about 4,900 feet in all—will have to be removed entirely, according to an opinion handed down by Judge S. J. M. McCarrell, of the Dauphin county court.

The order of Judge McCarrell winds to the contention of John B. Rider, owner of Duffy's island, with York Haven Water Power company, and removes walls and levees of the finest construction in the state.

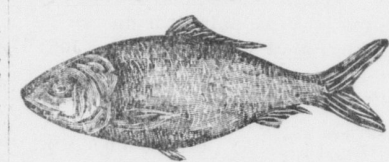
During the summer of 1908-09 the defendant company took possession of the eastern river bed and there constructed dams and ledges to afford them better facilities for power. The improvement had a most undesirable effect upon Duffy's island products and its tenants.

The stream that had heretofore irrigated the island was during the summer months dried up and at many places, pools of stagnant water formed.

This was two years ago. He asked the Dauphin county court at the time to make an order directing the removal of the obstructions from the eastern channel and yesterday's order was the result.

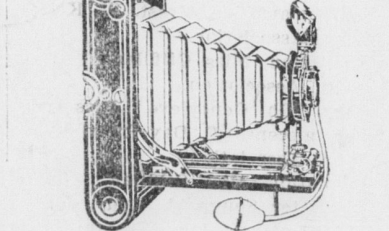
