TREES TO LANCASTER COUNTY

Watt and Shand, Lancasters' Foremost Merchants, Repeat a Gener-

A treat is in store for the school children of Lancaster Co. Messrs. Watt and Shand, Lancaster's fore most merchants, will fulfill their promise made to the teachers of the Lancaster County schools at the last County Institute, viz: by giving away 20,000 two year old American Elm Trees. Their idea being to give one free to every county school pupil who will agree to plant and nurture it in honor of Arbor Day.

In this way, they hope to engender

a love of nature in the hearts of the school children, to teach them in a practical way the true meaning of the day and its observance, to make them realize a closer personal interest in one great county and help preserve the beauty of a community that is truly named "The Garden Spot of the World." The custom of each person planting a tree on Arbor Day has largely grown of late years, and it is a beautiful one. Many cities are waking up to the importance of beautifying their streets and are taking measures to accomplish this object along the same lines and particularly in the lew England States, where the Amercian Elm is more widely known, regular societies have been organized for the one purpose of cultivating and growing trees where ever possible. Whole avenues of Trees are found growing in double roads on both sides of the streets in many of the cities and oads throughout the New England

their generosity. We feel that all in attendance as follows: it is botanically known, is a forest tree which frequently attains a height of from 100 to 120 feet, and a diameter of from 6 to 8 feet. Its average size is somewhat smaller alour hard wood trees. When growing in the open, the trunk almost in variably divides a short distance graceful spreading crown. Its natural growth is very extensive, ranging from Newfoundland to South Dakota and south through Western Nebraska to Texas. White Elm reaches its best development on deep fertile ground, moderately well drained but it can be grown on most any kind of soil, being a hardy tree and able to endure great extremes of temperature and moisture. It is a fairly rapid growing tree and often reaches a great age but naturally when planted in poor ground the raidity of growth and length of lifef

The wood of the White Elm is trong, tough, fibrous and difficult to split. It is in growing demand as a lack cooperage material and its use in this industry has resulted in a rapid increase in the stumpage value. The timber is also used for flooring, wheel stock, ship building and in the manufacture of agricultural implements. Its hardiness and its indifference to soil conditions make it a very suitable tree for protective planting. For ornamental planting the suitability of the White Elm is widely recognized everywhere. It is without the least doubt the most desirable of all our hard wood trees for such use. Such are the trees Messrs. Watt & Shand are giving away free to the pupils of Lancaster County.
