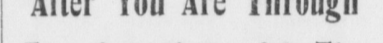

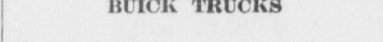

WHO IS WILLIAM FLINN?

Taft has 277 Delegates, Roosevelt 39 and the Merry Race Goes on—Table of Delegates

President Taft is making steady gains and apparently certain of a majority on first ballot.

Theodore Roosevelt showing remarkable strength in some sections, but losing ground in several States. Senator La Follette cutting into the Roosevelt following in some parts of the West.

That, seventy-four days before the Chicago convention, is the situation in the Republican presidential battle, as shown by the Herald's impartial country-wide canvass.
