Mealy Bugs on Potted Plants

One of the questions frequently asked Prof. H. A. Surface, State Zoologist of Harrisburg, is how to treat Mealy bugs on potted plants of the household or greenhouse. To such an inquiry he has replied as follows:

"The Mealy bug is a small, white or pinkish, soft insect which in appearance and habits is almost intermediate between scale insects and plant lice or aphids. It feeds on plants by sucking its long proboscis into the plant, injecting a poisonous saliva and sucking out the modified sap, as do other sucking insects. It stunts the growth of the plant, and often causes the leaves to turn pale and drop. It is particularly abundant on the coleus and geranium, but may attack almost any kind of potted plant. In fact, this and the scale are the two worst enemies of such plants, whether they be in the household or greenhouse. Treatment for the two is similar.

"Since Mealy bugs are sucking insects they can not be killed by any arsenical spray or poison that can be given to them, but must be destroyed by contact insecticides. Among the various things recommended for its destruction are as follows:

1. Spraying or washing with very strong tobacco decoction. This can be made either by steeping tobacco in water, or by buying the prepared tobacco leaf extract.

2. Make up a solution of soap and water, using one-half pound of soap in one gallon of water. To this add four or five tablespoonfuls of ammonia. Dip a soft sponge into the solution, and wash the plants with it. This is also the best remedy for the soft scale on whatever plants it may occur.

3. Set the plants into a vessel like a washbowl containing water as hot as the hand can stand, or by holding the earth in the crock with one hand, turn the plants upside down in such water, letting them remain two or three minutes.

4. Dip a finely tipped brush into pure kerosene or coal oil, and touch the Mealy bugs with this. One touch is sufficient to destroy the pests. Prune away and burn those parts that are worse infected."

Cut Worms on Garden Plants
A correspondent from Blair Co. recently wrote to Prof. H. A. Surface, State Zoologist, Harrisburg, Pa., asking for information concerning the destruction of cut-worms in his garden. The following timely reply was sent to him:

"Replying to your recent letter concerning the destruction of cut-worms on your garden plants and also liable to destroy your corn, I beg to say that the best thing to do is to kill them by the poison mash. Mix about equal parts of bran and middlings, and to about forty parts of this, by measure, add one part of Paris green, or dry arsenate of lead, or dry white arsenic, and stir it well together, while yet dry.

Then dissolve some coarse brown sugar in water, or use old strong molasses with water, and pour enough of this over the poison bran mixture to dampen it. Drop a point of a teaspoonful at each step or two over your garden or corn field in places where the pests are most numerous. A very small pinch placed at the base of each plant in the evening will be sure to prevent that plant from damage by the cut-worm.

"By scoring your corn field, and putting out the poison bran mash in the furrows in the evening, you can kill the cut-worms. Poultry can be kept from getting it by placing it under boards, or by covering it to a very slight depth with soil. It is better to put it out in the evening so it will remain damp.

"I know of a farmer in Lancaster county who very effectively cleaned up the cut-worms in his corn field, which was growing on sod ground of the previous year. He is well satisfied with the results."
