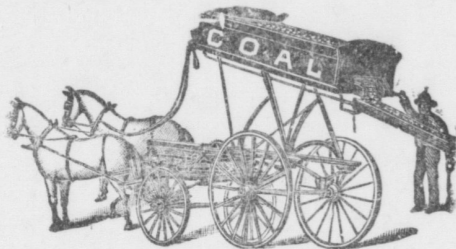

### FISHWAY AT MCCALL'S

Commissioner Buller Quite Content of Success

Commissioner of Fisheries Nathan R. Buller and the managers of the power company owning the dam on the Susquehanna river at McCall's Ferry have, after several months' negotiations, agreed on a tentative plan for a fishway which Commissioner Buller predicts will allow all kinds of migratory fish to ascend the Susquehanna river as they did before the great dam was erected.

The plans call for a canal system, which will be placed on the York county side of the river, and extending down the river between one and two miles. At the end of the canal-like sluiceway there will be placed a blind dam of such proportions that the fish coming up will be temporarily halted until they find their way into the canal-like fishway. While blue prints are not yet complete, the idea as worked out by Commissioner Buller has been accepted by the power company's engineers as the most feasible ever offered, and the engineers feel sure that it will be a success.

It is understood that the company's engineers are now conferring with the directors relative to the advancing of funds to construct the work, which it is expected will be begun about the middle of July, when the river is at its lowest stage. It is hardly expected that the work will be completed this year.

### WITH DIP NETS

Bushels of Shad now Caught in That Way Below Big Dam

Dippers for shad at McCall's Ferry rejoice over the removal of the 400-foot fishing limit below the great dam. Thousands of fish were taken in this manner in the shadow of the dam last week and the same work will continue till the season ends.

Hundreds of people from York and Lancaster counties are engaged in manipulating the big nets from every point of vantage below the dam. With the improvement in the catch prices dropped to 15 and 25 cents apiece for the fish.

One of the biggest catches by dippers is reported to have been made upon a rock near the middle of the river. Here about 2,000 shad were scooped from the water Friday of last week.

From a mass of rock near the York county shore three men caught 337 shad on Saturday, while others upon the dam made big catches.

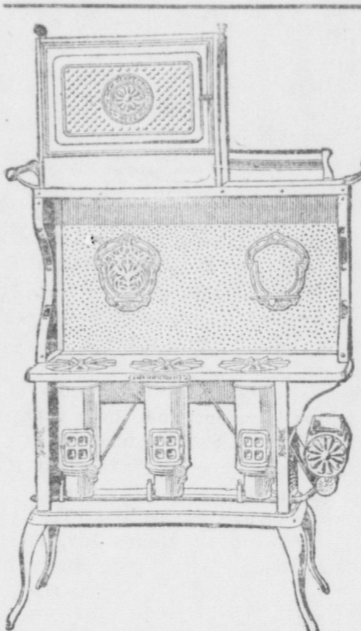
