



The week has witnessed the most extensive price change, since the ward movement that culminated the Government report early in the week, has been followed by a severe spring wheat outlook it reported attracted less attention, until heavy could do no less than compliment it. rainfall over the areas suffering from extreme drouth, put an end to oullish activity.
