TO KEEP LICE FROM POULTRY

## One of Most Difficult Problems That Confronts Chicken Fancier-Proper Proceedure.

(By R. G. WEATHERSTONE.) One of the most difficult problems which the poultry keeper has to meet is that of keeping his poultry houses and stock reasonably free from lice, In keeping a poultry plant free

from lice there are two points of attack: One, the birds themselves; the other, the houses, nest boxes, roosting boards, etc. In using any kind of lice powder on

the birds themselves, it should always be remembered that a single appli cation of powder is not sufficient When there are lice present on a bird there are always unhatched eggs of night have saved his senatorial lice ("nits") present, too. The proper procedure is to follow up a first appli cation of powder with a second at an interval of four days to a week. If the birds are badly infested at the
