





BUILDING A SHIPPING CRATE

To Get Correct Proportion and Still Make It Light Is Matter Requiring Thought and Experimenting.

To build a strong shipping crate in the correct proportion and still make it light in weight is a matter that can not be carried out without some thought and experimenting and for this reason I have drawn plans and built sample crates in an experimental way until the result is satisfactory to me, and I feel sure will be to those

the following lumber bills will if followed give correct results. The material, if a person is to use any number of these crates of a certain size he can best go to a box fac-

tory or mill and have them cut to or-

The long stock should consist of boards any length six inches wide by three-eighths inch thick to be used for bottom. Slats any length three inches wide by three-eighths inch thick. Frame stock any length three inches wide by three-fourths inch thick. Common stock spruce surfaced

It will be found desirable to make three sizes of these crates of a sultable height for broilers and fryers and at least two sizes for mature fowl and for turkeys.

Gather eggs daily. The profits in poultry culture are measured by the care given. It is useless to expect many eggs

from old fowls of any variety. All scraps of vegetables from the table should be given to the hens. A poultryman is judged by his surroundings and the condition of his

Hens need to be provided with a summer dust bath as well as in the winter.

Grit enables the gizzard to prepare the food for digestion. It is a fowl's false teeth.

The dropping-boards should be regularly cleaned and the filth removed from the houses. It is of little profit to have a good supply of eggs if we cannot market

them to advantage. A large part of the heavy loss from bad eggs can be obviated by the production of infertile eggs.

The market age of goslings is twelve weeks, which is a short time after they have feathered out. Chickens are creatures of habit. Whether they are lazy or active de-

pends largely on the way they are raised. The enemies of the fresh egg market are the preserved and the tested out incubator eggs. Be above such



When the market calls for a bird to be bled, the best plan is to stick it in the mouth; and by so doing avoid the unsightliness so common where they are hacked about the throat. Using this method, one should first of all have a stout cord




Where to Stick a Bird.

fastened to the ceiling, with a two pound weight attached to the lower end. This should be just high enough to hang the bird to be picked at a convenient height. The weight is used to save tying a knot each time; as all that is necessary is to wind the string around the bird's legs, and the weight will hold it securely. Use a box or barrel to catch the feathers: and a small paint-can, with a hook fastened to the handle, is hooked into the bird's mouth to catch the blood and prevent its soiling the feathers. It requires very little practice to kill the birds in this manner After the bird is hanged by the legs, cross the wings at the back and grasp the head in the left hand, the back of the head in the palm; and with the end of the second finger, hold the mouth open; then, with the knife in the right hand, make a diag onal cut across the roof of the mouth, just where the arteries enter the head. Then, with the point of the blade, pierce the brain in about the middle of the roof of the mouth, which will loosen the feathers. within six inches of the top with sifted hard coal ashes and some powdered tobacco stems. In a short time the ashes felt warm and the hens soon found this out. They have kept remarkably free from lice, due, we believe, to the tobacco. Fresh horse manure is put in two or three times during the winter.

No Living Thing Can Get Along Entirely Without It and Chickens Should Have Food Salted.

Many people labor under the impression that no salt should ever be put into poultry food, simply because highly salted food, such as salt fish or pickled meat, has sometimes killed chickens. As a matter of fact, no living thing can get along entirely without salt in some form. Chickens can always get salt in summer by eating which absorbs a certain grass, amount from the soil. But in winter it is different. During cold weather all prepared chicken food, such as mashes and boiled vegetables, should be salted in about the same propordone, the poultry will be healthier and more productive.


