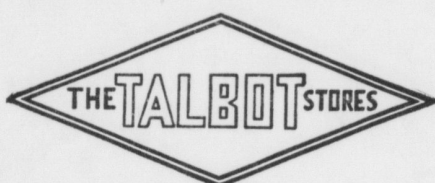

Leader Training Conference

The Lancaster County Committee of the Young Men's Christian Association will hold a Leader Training Conference, on the Methodist's camp grounds, Landisville, Aug. 10 and 11. Leaders of Young Men's Christian Associations from many towns in Lancaster county will be in attendance. Boys' Work, Secretaries and Rural and Village Work. Secretaries from the State Department in Pennsylvania will lead the conference. The training of leaders for boys' work will be discussed by these men. It is expected that between fifty and seventy-five leaders and prospective leaders of boys' work from the towns and country districts of the county will attend the conference. The County Committee has associations established in ten towns, with an enrollment of about 350 boys. The first session of the conference will be held on Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock, another session in the evening and two sessions on Sunday, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Arrangements have been made by the County Committee for sleeping accommodations at the camp grounds, and meals at twenty-five cents per head. A number of leaders from nearby towns will bring their lunches, and return home in the evening. The County Committee invites the clergy, teachers in boys' classes, Sunday Schools and all interested in the work for Lancaster County. In order to accommodate all who wish to attend the conference, the Committee requests the sending of your name to their headquarters at 346, Woolworth Building, Lancaster, Pa.

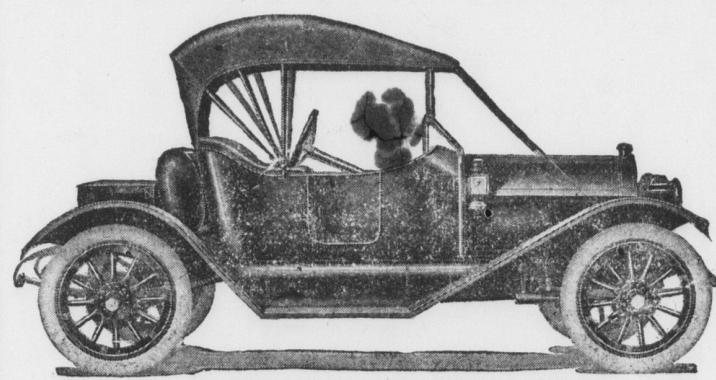
