MONEY FOR SCHOOLS

State Treasury Has Paid Only \$533,000 Out of \$7,500,000

Public school authorities all over the state are protesting that only a small fraction of the state appropriation, due last June, has been paid to the schools. In a number of districts the absence of state money at the beginning of the fall term is alleged to have necessitated temporary loans.

Because of the many protests the treasury is now hustling to get the money out. About 25 districts are being paid daily; but it will be the end of October before the last of the money is out.

The state appropriates \$7,500,000 a year for the public schools, but only \$533,000 of this has been paid, not withstanding the fact that there is a cash balance of more than \$7,000,000 in the banks that act as state depositories.

In the old days it used to be more or less of a scandal the way the school money was held back so that favored banks could have the use of it; but in recent years there has been little to complain of in that respect until now.

The amount of such money apportioned to the districts of Lancaster county is over \$150,000. The exact amount for each district is here with given. It is for the year ending June 30, 1912.
