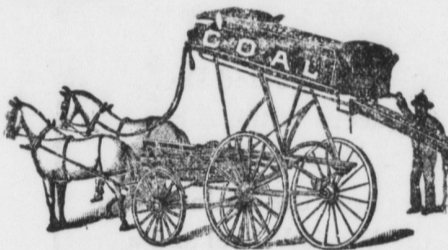

Motorists' Action Against Turnpike

After hearing reports of the bad condition of the Harrisburg turnpike between Oreville and Bamford the Lancaster Automobile Club at its September meeting held at Quarryville on Friday evening decided to recommend to motorists a partial boycott of the turnpike for refusing all summer to repair the road by avoiding that section of road in using the East Petersburg State road and the Manheim turnpike. By the latter route the toll charges are less.

A communication was read from the Pennsylvania Motor Federation asking the club members to use their influence in electing to the Legislature only such men as will favor the resolution authorizing the state to issue bonds for fifty million dollars for road improvements. This resolution must pass the next Legislature before it can be submitted to a popular vote. As real estate pays no state taxes in Pennsylvania and never can until the voters of the state vote for such a proposition the interest on the bonds can never fall on real estate but must be of the State revenues.

Six applications for membership were presented at the meeting, President Wolf being in the chair, and eight new members were elected. C. M. Reiling, chairman of the good roads committee, reported having made a tour of the Sprout routes and finding the State doing much superior work to any done before. In the north-eastern section the road drag is being extensively used. Martin E. Brenner, superintendent of roads for Lancaster county, has gathered together an able force and is actively engaged in improving the roads under his charge, great improvement being expected on these roads in another month.

On the suggestion of President Wolf each member will approach his friends who have teams and urge them to display a light at night on their vehicles for their own safety and convenience starting a movement to increase the safety of all users of the highways. Also at President Wolf's suggestion a pushmobile race will be held for the boys, a committee having been appointed to make the arrangements. New Holland was selected for the October meeting.

Beware of the Frost-proof Tree Man

State Zoologist H. A. Surface is responsible for the statement that a man from Lock Haven, Pa., is going through the State selling trees, which he claims are frost-proof, but which statement must not be believed. Doctor Surface says that a few years ago this same man went through Tioga county, selling trees that he claimed were grafted on oak roots to make them borer-proof. The farmers at that time had a great deal of trouble with him, but finally managed to cancel their orders before the trees were delivered.

Persons who desire to buy trees should procure them from reliable nurseries, and avoid dealing with tree agents whom they do not know, and who can not furnish satisfactory credentials. They should not sign their name to any order or paper until they are entirely satisfied that it can not be changed into some kind of a note, bill, or order that was not intended.

THE GAME LAWS

Secretary Kalbfus Issues a Summary Showing Open Seasons

Secretary Joseph Kalbfus has issued the following table of animals and birds declared to be game in Pennsylvania, when they may be killed, the number, etc.

Bear, unlimited, October 1 to January 1. Use of steel traps forbidden.

Black birds, all kinds, and doves, unlimited, September 1 to January 1.

Deer, male with horns visible above the hair, one each season, November 15 to December 1.

English, Mongolian, Chinese and Ringneck pheasants, ten in one day, twenty in one week and fifty in one season, November 1 to December 15.

Hare or rabbit, ten in one day, November 1 to December 15.

Hungarian quail, five in one day, twenty in one week and thirty in one season, October 15 to November 15.

Plover, unlimited, July 15 to December 1.

Quail, commonly called Virginia partridge, ten in one day, forty in one week and seventy-five in one season, November 1 to December 15.

Raccoon, unlimited, September 1 to January 1.

Ruffed grouse, commonly called pheasant, five in one day, twenty in one week and fifty in one season, November 1 to December 15.

Shore birds, unlimited, September 1 to January 1.

Snake, jack or Wilson, unlimited, September 1 to May 1.

Squirrel, fox, black or grey, six of the combined kinds in one day, November 1 to December 15.

Webfooted wild water fowl of all kinds, unlimited, September 1 to April 10. Not to be shot at before sunrise of any day.

Wild turkeys, one in one day, two in one season, November 1 to December 15.

Woodcock, ten in one day, twenty in one week and fifty in one season, October 1 to December 1.

The secretary adds: "Feed the birds during the winter if you want to have them next year."

Grading Fruits

While the apple crop in the greater part of Pennsylvania is not more than fifty per cent of a full crop, most of the orchards that have been used as demonstration and supervision orchards of the Division of Zoology, of the Department of Agriculture, have such crops of unusually fine fruits that State Zoologist Surface has sent the owners the following brief directions for grading, which will be found timely and useful to other fruit growers.

To aid in assorting apples to uniform sizes for boxing, a sizing board with a row of holes will be helpful. These holes should be about 2 1/2 in. to 3 in. in diameter, representing the different sized apples that are put into boxes. The grader will soon become able to dispense with the sizing board except when in doubt. The apples are held up to the hole, but are never dropped through. An ordinary table covered with a layer of canvas or soft cloth can be used on which to spread the apples in grading. Winter varieties can be assorted into four grades:

1. The finest for boxes: This should consist of well colored and finest fruit of high quality varieties, free from blemishes, and of fine finish and uniform size.

2. First grade for barrels: Next sizes to box apples, free from blemishes and bruises, and of uniform size throughout the barrel.

3. Second grade for barrels: Second grade includes the smaller sizes of sound fruit, free from blemishes.

4. Culls: These include all the rest of the fruit, and usually should not be sent to the market to compete with the better grades, but used for evaporating, canning and cider.

It pays well to grade fruits to uniform size and color. To market small fruits in the same package as large ones means to destroy the selling value of both. It is just as important to keep fruits free from bruises, as it is to sort out those that are more or less decayed; and sorting, therefore, should be regarded as a distinct and separate process from grading, but must be done before the grading is undertaken. Also, fruits can be graded and sorted at the same time.
