Work Horse Bulletins

The Farm Work Horse will be the title of a new farmers' bulletin which will be prepared and issued by the United States Department of Agriculture in the near future. The issuance of such a publication is the result of suggestions made to the officials of the Agricultural Department by Congressman W. W. Griest of Lancaster. During the last session of Congress the House of Representatives passed a resolution authorizing the printing of a pamphlet entitled The Road Horse, a very interesting and instructive article on the care and treatment of horses. This publication, the preparation of which had also been suggested by Mr. Griest, met with much public favor, and the Congressman then made the suggestion for a farm horse bulletin.

Congressman Griest has secured a large number of copies of the Road Horse bulletin and is prepared to furnish a copy of the pamphlet to any one who will mail their request to him.

THE PARCEL POST

Prices That Will Be Charged For Sending Packages Through the Mail

The parcel post law goes into effect on January 1st. It provides that hereafter fourth class mail matter shall embrace all other matter, including farm and factory products, not now embraced by laws in either the first, second, or third class not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, nor greater in size than seventy two inches in length and six combined, nor in form or kind likely to injure the person or any postal employe or damage the mail equipment or other mail matter and not of a character perishable within a period reasonably required for transportation and delivery.

Postmaster Trout has received schedules of prices for packages of different weights. For the purpose of carrying the law into effect the United States is divided into zones with different rates of postage applicable to each. For instance a package of one pound can be sent to any local point for five cents. The prices increase according to distance from one to eleven pounds. For the latter weight 15 cents is charged. Within a radius of 50 miles the price is from 5 to 25 cents. For from 50 to 150 miles the price is from 6 to 46 cents. For from 150 to 300 miles it runs from 7 to 57 cents. From 300 to 600 miles the price is from 8 to 68 cents. From 600 to 1,000 miles it ranges from 9 to the price is from 10 cents to \$1. For 79 cents. From 1,000 to 1,400 miles for from 1,400 to 1,800 miles the price is from 11 cents to \$1.11 and all over 1,800 is from 12 cents per pound to \$1.32.
