I presume many of you will want to 'swat" me for discussing again the same old subject of the fly, but I would have a big job if in turn I was to swat every one of you that have read and approved of what I have told you about the fly and done absolutely othing to prevent its breeding.

Now, it is a fact which you cannot easonably dispute, that if your horss and cows were free from the cruel bother of flies during the entire summer, they would be able to render you greater service and be in better condition in the fall. Isn't that so? Putting it on a purely cash basis, regardless of the health of lives of your family and it would pay you and all of your neighbors to prevent the fly from breeding. But looking at the matter of only one case of typhoid fever in your family in five years and from that standpoint alone it would pay you to eliminate the flies from your premises.

Impossible? Not a bit of it. If you have lots of stock around your barns then you must have lots of land and should have a manure spreader. There is always some field or pasture where it can be spread at any time, and the land is better and the value of the manure is greater if spread while fresh. Just a short bit of time every morning and you have finished a job that must be done at some season and why not now? Keep the barns clean and the manure scattered out on the fields, where it does good instead of harm and the flies cannot find breeding place except around a Valley, suitable for truck, grain, filthy back door, the slop barrel, gar- dairy, and tobacco." bage can or the hog pen.

It is barely possible that the trouble is chiggers, and if such is the case, a simple home treatment is to apply well salted butter. Carbolated seline is also good. TRAIN KILLS A MAN

Wolf, Aged Twenty-One, of Petersburg, the Victim

A terrible accident occurred on the tate road, near East Petersburg, on

Thursday morning, in which a young man was instantly killed. John Wolf, teamster for H. W. Graybill, the coal and lumber dealer at East Petersburg, was on his way to Landisville for a load of brick with a two-horse team. He was obliged to cross the tracks of the Pennsylvania Railroad cut off and at that place the accident occurred. He had halted for the passing of one train and then went on, and just as he was on the tracks and too late to get out of harm's way, he observed another train hundering on at a mile a minute clip and he was caught. The young man was horribly mangled and instantly killed, the wagon was broken into splinters and only one of the norses was slightly injured at the

News of the accident spread rapidv and soon a large crowd of people gathered on the scene. His body was taken to Landisville and later to his

Deceased was a son of John Henry Wolf, of East Petersburg, formerly of Mt. Hope. Had he lived until July he would have been twenty-one vears old.

ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

At Gettysburg-Emergency Hospital to be Established

Arrangements have been complet ed for the establishment of an emergency hospital of 175 beds to care for the thousands of visitors from every State in the Union who will attend the fiftieth anniversary elebration of the Battle of Gettysburg. The hospital will be conducted by the State Department of Health and will be under the personal super vision of Commissioner Samuel G

The State G. A. R. Encampmen be 55,000 visitors in addition to the 32,000 Union and Confederate veterans who will be present.

Governor Tener has ordered the Commissioner of Health to take all necessary steps to safe-guard the health and add to the comfort of the visitors.

The emergercy hospital will consist of 30 hospital tents and accommodations for the 16 doctors and 18 nurses who will be on duty. It will nave a commissary department, a ully equipped operating tent with a consulting surgeon constantly at hand. There will be in addition two hospital cars in order that serious or operative cases may be transferred daily to the hospitals in nearby cit-

In addition to the main hospitals there will be two dispensaries wth six beds each with a nurse and physi-

cian in charge. One of these will be located at the railroad station to care for any visitors who may be ill upon arrival and one located near the great assembly tent where the meetings are to be

held. Marine Telescope. Make an oblong narrow box out of four pieces of quarter-inch board about two feet long by sixteen inches wide, and fit a piece of clear, clean glass headed tacks, driven into the wood and overlapping the glass, Fill all the cracks with sealing wax to keep out the light.
