The Week in Grain

Philad., Pa., May 28, 1913. Something of a crop scare has developed over the winter wheat belt and while indications are that prospective losses are not material, the disposition has been to reduce previous high estimates. A rather extended dry spell has existed in sections of Oklahoma and western Kansas, and with the appearance of chinch bugs, occasioned some excitement. In this connection, while all exports have lowered their estimates for this region, it is doubtful if the crop promise ever justified many of the claims that were advanced. As matters stand the outlook for winter wheat, at this writing, was never better, and while perfection is not to be anticipated in any season, it will take a well defined and wide spread turn to unfavorable weather, to reduce the yield to even an average crop.

Marketwise, there have been advances all thru the list, but with the gain in wheat prices rather narrow and not well sustained. Selling has steadily been in evidence on strong spots, and reports of damage have not been uniform enough to furnish the buying power to absorb. Oats have moved up sharply again, leading the list; with corn also in good demand. The cold month is definitely against the course grain outlook, decidedly more so than wheat. The winter wheat crop is approaching maturity, and losses now will merely reduce a previous unprecedented outlook. But coarse grains are not starting well. The weather has been unfavorable for germination and the early development and strengthening of the root growth, that is necessary to protect against drought or other unfavorable conditions should they develop later. With a poor start it will only take a few days of unfavorable weather any time during the growing season to give the plant an unhealthy appearance. Woe, and renew speculative alarm.

On the whole the trade is broadening, with increased public participation, and the outlook is for a healthy trading market, with the price trend dependent upon the weather.

Suppressing The Dust Nuisance

The clouds of dust that every breeze stirs up or the increasing automobile traffic generates during the warm months when the road surface quickly dries into dust under the rays of a hot sun now present a serious problem to those living along the main traveled highways.

Excepting smoothness of surface perhaps nothing is more essential to the comfort and well being of those using a road or living in its immediate vicinity than that it be free from dust. Sprinkling with water as a means of suppressing the dust is not practicable on the ordinary country road; therefore, artificial dust layers must be resorted to, oil being about the most conveniently applied and most economical. An application of oil now will effectually lay the dust and preserve the surface of the road during the dry summer months. The oil can be applied to earth roads as well as to macadam, being a very substantial improvement to the former by producing a surface firm but not hard. The surface of the road should not be treated with the oil until after it has been properly crowned and care should be exercised to keep the oil crust intact.

In treating a macadam road the surface should be swept clean, the road having first been placed in good condition. With sprinklers the oil should be applied at the rate of from one-third to one-half gallon per square yard. The road should be perfectly dry and the oil applied only in dry, warm weather.

IS HELD FOR FRAUD

Is Under \$1,500 Bail Charged With Issuing Fake Insurance

Charged with writing fake fire insurance, some of which covered the Columbia Hospital, in Columbia, of which he is president, former State Senator C. C. Kaufman, who helped to organize the Danville Bessemer Steel Company, was arrested at his home last Saturday. Besides being charged with dealing in wildcat insurance, he is accused of obtaining money under false pretense.

Although Kaufman was arrested several days ago on an affidavit sworn to by Robert C. Wilson, a special investigator of the state insurance department, the news of his arrest became generally known on Tuesday. Kaufman is out on \$1,500 bail on the two charges. He will have a hearing this week.

Profitable to Uncle Sam

The Postoffice Department realized a profit of \$180,000 on the sale of stamp books last year. Postmaster General Burleson has approved designs for two stamps and the other 24 one-cent and 24 two-cent stamps. All books sell at one cent over the actual value of the stamps contained therein.
