 Commissioner Buller Looks Over McCall's Ferry Construction

State Fish Commissioner Buller is taking a decided interest in the new fish dam now being constructed at McCall's Ferry for the purpose of furnishing an unimpeded passage for fish up the Susquehanna river, and if the affair works at it is hoped it will, there will be shad galore in the vicinity of Shenks Ferry, Safe Har-

bor, Creswell, Washingtonboro, Columbia, Marietta and Bainbridge next spring. Commissioner Buller has just returned from a visit to the operations, and says that everything is progressing satisfactorily, and from the present outlook the dam will be finished by the end of the month, at least. It is being constructed on the York side of the river and made to resemble a natural rock bed, sloping from the face of the dam down the stream, and fish can have no difficulty in getting up

the slope, the bed resembling the natural bed of the river. On Friday Commissioner Buller will leave for Boston to attend the meeting of the American Fish Culture Association, and while in Boston will be the guest of Daniel Fearing, the wealthy fish culturist who takes a great interest in such matters. He will read a paper on the food fishes of Pennsylvania and what is being done to increase their number.
