NOTICE TO PUBLIC

Rules and Regulations to Govern Visitors to Masonic Home Grounds

The Masonic Home property, consisting of 998 acres, in West Donegal township, Lancaster county, is owned by a fee simple title by the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Pennsylvania.

It is maintained for persons who are the guests of this Grand Lodge, many of whom are frail in health and physically infirm. They are entitled to the use, at all times, of all the roads, paths and ways on the premises, for healthful exercise and in pursuit of their special occupation.

All roads heretofore open for public use on the property, were regularly vacated as public highways by a decree of the court of Quarter Sessions of Lancaster County.

All roads, ways and paths now in use on the property have been constructed and are maintained by the owner for private purposes solely.

All persons are welcome as visitors to the grounds and buildings, but in order to safeguard the guests from injurious accidents, it is necessary to regulate and restrict the use of these roads, paths and ways.

The following regulations must be obeyed:

1. No bicycles, motor cycles, wagons or carts used for trade or business purposes will be permitted on any of said roads, paths or ways.
2. Visitors in automobiles, or other passenger conveyances, are requested to call first at the Grand Lodge Hall, register in the office of the Superintendent, and receive a permit card to go over the property, with a guide or key to open the fastenings at the gate ways.
3. Visitors will not be allowed to use the roads, paths or ways after eight o'clock in the summer and six o'clock in the winter months.
4. Children must be accompanied by adults.
5. Pedestrian travel must be confined to the roads and paths.
6. No trespassing of any kind will be permitted.
7. The shrubbery, flowers, fruits and landscapes decorations are committed to the protection of guests and visitors.

The hearty co-operation of all persons is requested to preserve this Masonic Home property from any damage, and the guests from any physical injury, so that these premises will be an undertaking that will inspire state pride in all citizens, as well as personal interest among the members of the Fraternity.
