An Ordinance

AWARDING TO THE EDISON ELECTRIC COMPANY THE CONTRACT FOR LIGHTING THE STREETS OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY BY ELECTRICITY, FROM THE FIFTEENTH

DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1913, TO THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1915, WITH THE PRIVILEGE OF THE SAID BOROUGH TO RENEW THE SAID CONTRACT FOR AN ADDITIONAL TERM OF EIGHT YEARS FROM THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1915.

Whereas, the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, acting through the duly appointed Light Committee of said Council, have heretofore received a bid from the Edison Electric Company for the lighting of the streets of said Borough, by electricity, from the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1913, to the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1915, both dates inclusive, with privilege of said Borough to renew the said contract for an additional term of eight years from the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1915, at the price and upon the terms hereinafter expressed, which are agreeable and acceptable to the said Council.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same.

SECTION 1. That the contract for the lighting of the streets of the

Borough of Mount Joy, by electricity, from the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1913, to the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1915, both dates inclusive, be and is hereby awarded to the Edison Electric Company, upon the following terms and prices, that is to say:

First: The said Company shall furnish and supply One hundred and fourteen (114) more or less, 40 watt Mazda Tungsten lamps, and seven (7) more or less, 80 watt Mazda Tungsten lamps, to burn from sundown to sunrise every night, for the purpose of lighting the streets in the Borough, for the sum of Thirteen Dollars and fifty cents per light per annum for each forty (40) watt lamp, and the sum of twenty-five Dollars and fifty cents per light per annum for each 80 watt lamp, and shall furnish all poles, wires, lamps and fixtures necessary for such lighting at its own expense.

Second: All of the said lights shall be located at such points and places on the streets and squares of said Borough as the Council of said Borough, acting through its Light Committee, may designate.

Third: The said Company shall furnish, free of charge, during term of the contract, or any renewal or extension thereof, interior lighting for the Borough Council chamber, fire engine room and lockup.

Fourth: In case the said Company

shall fail to keep the supporting poles, lamps and fixtures in such repair as shall be satisfactory to the Light Committee of Councils aforesaid, said Committee may cause such repairs to be made, at the expense of the said Company, and such expense shall be deducted from any amount which may then or thereafter be or become due unto the said Company, and if, for any reason, any of the lights fail to burn, a pro rata deduction shall be made for the time of such failure.

Fifth: The Borough shall have the privilege to extend the said contract, at the same prices and on the same terms for an additional period of eight years from the fifteenth day of November, A. D. 1915.

SECTION 2. That the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Mount Joy be and is directed to execute, and to cause to be executed, a copy of said Borough, and an agreement or contract with the Edison Electric Company, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance.
