AUTO CLUB ELECTS

Held its Annual Meeting at Hotel
Wheatland, at Lancaster Friday

For the third consecutive term Dr.
William A. Wolf was chosen as presi-
dent of the Lancaster Automobile
Club at its annual meeting at Hotel
Wheatland, Lancaster, on Friday
evening, March 20. The other officers
elected follow: First vice president,
Aaron B. Landis, of Rohrerstown;
second vice president, Edward D.
Ruth, secretary, J. G. Forney, treas-
urer, Dr. W. H. Trout; directors, L.
F. McAllister, of Quarryville, Charles
M. Belling and H. M. Moore.

The annual reports were a proud
record of achievement for the past
year and also showed the club to be
in a flourishing condition financially
and numerically. Secretary Forney
reported that during the past year
149 new members had been elected
compared with a total of eighty
seven during the previous year.
There were fewer losses in member-
ship, and the total membership is
now 334. The report of Dr. W. H.
Trout, treasurer, showed a balance of
\$1,045.58 in the treasury, and the
auditors, M. E. Musser and C. S.
Mellinger reported the accounts cor-
rect.

That the work of the legal depart-
ment had been of a broader scope
during the past year and was more
widely beneficial to the members
was shown by the report of S. R.
Zimmerman, the solicitor. A number
of claims against members for
damages had been satisfactorily
settled, unwarranted damages having
been avoided. Advice of a legal
nature had been furnished to many
members as well as to the officers.
Through this department had been
effected an improvement in many bad
roads without expensive litigation.
The solicitor concluded that if the
policy of peaceful compulsion is not
effective another procedure will be
adopted, and urged upon the club to
be aggressive but not vindictive.

Charles M. Belling, chairman of
the Good Roads Committee, reported
having made with President Wolf a
visit to Harrisburg to meet repre-
sentatives of the Harrisburg, Middle-
town, Palmyra and Hagerstown
motor clubs, and as a result of the
conference it is expected to develop
a spirit of co-operation that will be
of benefit to all the clubs.

Ten new members secured during
the past month were elected. For
having secured the largest number of
new members during the past year,
it was decided to present prizes to
L. F. McAllister, of Quarryville, who
headed the Honor Roll with thirty-
two members to his credit, and Dr.
A. H. Stubbs, of Peters Creek who
stood second with twenty new mem-
bers.

Wild Turkeys Plentiful in State

"The number of wild turkeys in
Pennsylvania right now is more than
they were forty years ago," asserted Dr.
Joseph Kalbfus, secretary of the
State Game Commission Tuesday.
"I have received letters from many
sportsmen and I find that the birds have
withstood the blizzard splendidly.
There are wild turkeys right here in
Dauphin county. I have a letter
from a citizen who owns 400 acres
of land and who reported seeing
thirty birds, and at the time of the
storm sent corn to feed them." Dr.
Kalbfus says that the two-
year closed season for turkeys has
been a great thing, as the birds have
multiplied rapidly. It is only a few
years since an alarm was sounded in
behalf of the turkey, as there was
real danger of extermination.

sylvania,


