CONTRACT TO BE AWARDED
Citizens of Landisville and Salunga Meet To Discuss Lights
At a town meeting held at the warehouse of Root and Baker at Salunga Monday evening, the street lighting problem of Salunga and Landisville was discussed. The light was formerly furnished through the agency of an individual, M. A. Moore and the contract expired.
Superintendent Von Neida was president in the interest of the Edison Electric Company and promised to furnish light to the boroughs for the sum of \$13.50 a light, providing 40 lights were used.
Two committees were appointed from each town to solicit funds from

the citizens for the lights. The following are the committees, Landisville, Simon Minnich, Harry Cozer, Jonas Minnich; Salunga, Henry L. Menecker, J. S. Wise, A. B. Kreider. About 50 citizens were in attendance.
