At this time of year, numerous requests are received for concise conty. After many weeks of industry trol measures for various insect and study, the result will be shown at troubles affecting fruit and vegetable to tell the public the condition of my Juniors—John Booth, Harold Harwhich kept me awake nights for two crops. Lack of space will not permit entering into details. For this reason, general rather than particular control will be stated.

Two general classes of combative materials are used according as the insect chews or sucks its food; First in the city, will show episodes in our internal poisons which kills the insect when eaten with its food (leaves, flowers, etc.) And second, external poisons which kill insects

the leaves. To reduce the burning property an amount of freshly slacked lime should be added equal to the ate of 68 ounces per 50 gallons of vater or fungicide. It is not very adsable to use this material on stone uit trees, as the peach.

> London Purple contains more solule arsenic than Paris Green and hould be used in less amount. It s generally not advisable to use this oison except with Bordeaux mixture. Arsenate of Lead is fast supplantg other arsenic poisons because i less injurious to foliage. This oison is supplied to the market in eneral two to four pounds of paste fifty gallons of water.

Hellebore is a vegetable poison brood. which serve both as an insecticide injury. and a fungicide.
