 sickness or disease of any kind in the borough.
 Mr. J. H. Wharvell appeared before Council in reference to the amount of water rent charged him on a property he recently purchased. This matter was amicably adjusted.
Treasurer's Report
 The report of the Union National Mt. Joy bank, treasurer, showed balances in the three accounts as follows: Borough, \$3,046.72; Water, \$2,338.30; Interest, \$524.00.
 Collector of Water rents Mr. Feltenbaum then read his list of delinquent water renters, the total amount of which was \$227.34. Upon motion he was ordered to collect same as per ordinance.
 Surveyor M. N. Brubaker then presented the final drawing showing the proposed borough extension lines. The lines are same as given in these columns recently with the exception that the row of houses owned by Mr. C. G. Sherk, near the bridge, are left outside the borough. The line goes from a point on the Manheim road diagonally across W. B. Detwiler's land at his barn to a point at the creek, but including the Hoffman property.
 Blue prints will now be made of the proposed line and the matter will be placed in the hands of Solicitor Hensel to prepare an ordinance and a petition. Said petition will then be circulated for the signatures of the property owners interested.
 After the payment of a number of bills Council adjourned.
