Firewood Consumption in Pennsylvania

Washington, D. C. Aug.—There are 1,648,000 cords of wood valued at \$3,709,000 consumed on the farms of Pennsylvania annually according to a report which has just been issued by the United States Department of Agriculture.

In Continental United States the annual consumption of firewood amounts to 85,337,000 cords, valued at \$250,000. Of this amount 69,961,000 cords are used on the farms.
