WILL EXTEND BORO

By Per Cent. of the Property Owners Favor the Project

At the last meeting of Mt. Joy Borough Council, Councilman D. F. ... presented the official petition drawn up by Solicitor W. U. ... in reference to extending the borough limits of Mount Joy.

It was suggested and ordered that Mr. M. N. Brubaker circulate said petition for the approval of the property owners effected by the extension. There are thirty-six persons in this proposed annexed section and on Monday morning Mr. Brubaker informed us that he had succeeded in getting the signatures of twenty-nine of them, with but one man to see.

By this method of procedure the law requires the signatures of 51 per cent. of the property owners and as this is just 80% per cent., borough extension is now a certainty.

This petition will now be presented to Council after which an ordinance will be drawn, passed and Mt. Joy borough limits are extended.
