HOME HEALTH CLUB

Bright Spots:—A few months ago I walked along a noisy, busy business street in Chicago. On one place there were three old frame houses that still stood, though all around them were big blocks of business buildings. One of them was unoccupied. Several dirty children played in the little yard of another, while an old couple was just moving into the third. I felt sorry for the old couple, they looked so out of place in that old house with the poor yard and rickety old fence in front.

In the spring I again passed the place and I saw the little old woman working in the little front yard. It was not more than ten feet by fifteen feet, but she had made several little flower beds and a lot of little narrow, winding paths between. I saw little boxes on the windows and small green leaves peeping up along the old fence. Yesterday I walked there again and when I was opposite the old house I stopped in amazement, apparently every one else that passed the place also stopped and lingered as long as they could spare time to linger. When they passed on there was usually a pleasant smile and a far away look in their eyes as though pleasant memories had been revived. The rickety old fence was entirely hidden by a mass of beautiful, climbing vines while a very beautiful little dutch flower garden smiled up at every one and seemed to speak of peace and health and brightness. Part of the dingy old front of the house was covered with flowers that grew in the window boxes. I looked farther and in the back yard I saw growing, corn, lettuce, onions, cabbage, turnips, radishes and other thrifty, vigorous vegetables. The other two back yards as well as the front were covered with rubbish, weeds, boxes and kitchen waste. The children playing about would occasionally go to the partition fence and look longingly at the beautiful garden.

The same difference I find in the country. One farmhouse will be surrounded by a beautiful and well kept lawn, flowers abundant and a garden that keeps the table well supplied with delicious fresh vegetables and fruits, with plenty to put in the cellar for winter use. The family are vigorous, healthy and happy. Cheerfulness abounds and life is worth living. At the very next farm I find weeds growing all about the yard, old plows, broken wagons, delapidated buggies, boxes, barrels and hen coops are thickly scattered where the garden should be. Sickly and unhappy looking people live there. Do you live in one of the bright spots or are you a party to the eye sores that may be so frequently seen on all sides?

Much of disease and suffering is really dirt and don't care. It means work, of course, to make a lawn look clean and well kept but it pays even if you do live in a rented house. It pays, brightness adds to cheerfulness and happiness and accumulation of these spell health.

Next year I expect to see all three of these yards in the busy Chicago street filled with flowers and vegetables. The object lesson is so wonderfully good, so forcible that it will not be lost. Others will be inspired in other parts of the city and the little bright spot will be a blessing to many besides the old couple in the third house.

INCREASE OF INDEBTEDNESS

Notice is hereby given to all the electors of the School District of the Borough of Mount Joy, County of Lancaster and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in pursuance and by the authority of a resolution by the Board of School Directors of the said School District, passed by the Board of School Directors of the said School District, passed the 22nd day of September A. D. 1914, that a public election will be held on Tuesday, the third day of November, A. D. 1914, between the hours of seven o'clock A. M. and seven o'clock P. M., at Washington House, West Ward and Exchange Hotel, East Ward, in the said Borough of Mount Joy, the usual places of holding the general elections in said School District of the Borough of Mount Joy aforesaid, for the purpose of obtaining the assent of the qualified electors of said School District to an increase in the bonded indebtedness of said School District.

The Board of School Directors, the said Board of School Directors, by resolution duly passed by a unanimous affirmative vote of all the members of the said Board of School Directors, on the eighth day of September, A. D. 1914, duly recorded on the minutes of said Board of School Directors, showing how each member voted, have signified their desire for such increase of indebtedness agreeably to the Act of Assembly approved the 20th day of April, 1874, P. L. 65.

The amount of the last assessed valuation of taxable property in said School District is \$889,370.00.

The total amount of the existing debt of said School District is \$14,500.00.

The amount of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District is \$10,000.00.

The percentage of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District, computed upon the last assessed valuation, is \$1.13588%.

The purpose of the proposed increase of the bonded indebtedness of the said School District is for the erection, furnishing and equipping of an annex to the public school building in said School District, situated on Marietta Street, in said Borough of Mount Joy.

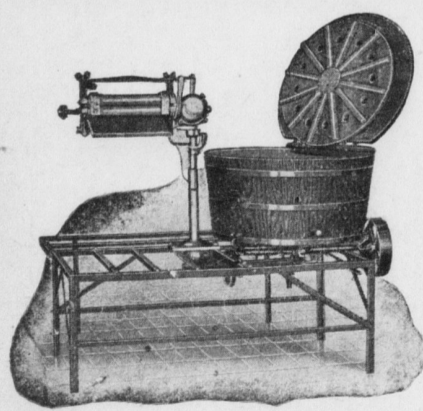
