INCREASE OF INDEBTEDNESS

Notice is hereby given to all the electors of the School District of the Borough of Mount Joy, County of Lancaster and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in pursuance and by the authority of a resolution by the Board of School Directors of the said School District, passed by the Board of School Directors of the said School District, passed the 22nd day of September A. D. 1914, that a public election will be held on Tuesday, the third day of November, A. D. 1914, between the hours of seven o'clock A. M. and seven o'clock P. M., at Washington House, West Ward and Exchange Hotel, East Ward, in the said Borough of Mount Joy, the usual places of holding the general elections in said School District of the Borough of Mount Joy aforesaid, for the purpose of obtaining the assent of the qualified electors of said School District to an increase in the bonded indebtedness of said School District.

The Board of School Directors, the corporate authorities of the said School District, by a resolution duly passed by a unanimous affirmative vote of all the members of the said Board of School Directors, on the eighth day of September, A. D. 1914, duly recorded on the minutes of said Board of School Directors, showing how each member voted, have signified their desire for such increase of indebtedness agreeably to the Act of Assembly approved the 20th day of April, 1874, P. L. 65.

The amount of the last assessed valuation of taxable property in said School District is \$880,370.00.

The total amount of the existing debt of said School District is \$14,500.00.

The amount of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District is \$10,000.00.

The percentage of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District, computed upon the last assessed valuation, is 1.13588%.

The purpose of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District is for the erection, furnishing and equipping of an annex to the public school building in said School District, situated on Marletta Street, in said Borough of Mount Joy.
