In many cases vomitting occurs and with the sore throat scarlet fever is suspected. As a rule a terrific headache is the next symptom and then pain in the back of the head at the base of the brain. The ears and eyes suffer and in many cases either partial or complete deafness in one ear results.

Vigorous and prompt should be the treatment at the first symptoms of cold. A thorough physic should be given but don't wait for it to act.
