

day night. Her death was due largely to old age. She was born at Cone-wago, Dauphin county, on February 11, 1844 and had lived in Marietta, since her marriage in 1860. She was a member of the Evangelical church and a teacher in the Sunday school as long as her health would permit. Besides her husband, two children survive: Mrs. Anna Mueller, of Lancaster and Rev. Dr. Joseph Stump, of Philipsburg, New Jersey. Thirteen grandchildren, and four great grandchildren also survive, with the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Catherine Ebersole, of Columbia; Mrs. Mary Shrite, Mount Joy; Mrs. Louisa Brandt, Mount Joy; Abraham of New Mexico; Mrs. John W. Haas, Marietta; John, of Florin, and William, of Columbia. The funeral will be held this Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, from the Lutheran church.

Alfred C. Kennedy
Word reached here of the death of Alfred C. Kennedy, who died at his home in Omaha, Nebraska, after a lingering illness which cut his life short at the age of 53 years. He was suffering from heart trouble for more than a year, was unable to leave his house for the past eight months and bedfast the past two months. Mr. Kennedy began his business career going out with a Union Pacific surveying party in 1879 after which he became clerk in the coal department of the Union Pacific. Later he engaged in the real estate business and continued it until his health failed about a year ago. He was an active participant in public affairs and for two terms he was a member of the Omaha Board of Education. His father, Howard Kennedy, was the first school teacher in Omaha after the public school system was inaugurated on November 10, 1859. Deceased is a grandson of Jacob R. Long, for many years cashier of the Union National Bank of this place. When a boy he was a frequent visitor here and is very well known here by many of our citizens. His last visit here was last August when in company with Mr. George D. Long, another well known old resident of this borough, now living at Frederick, Md., spent some time in this community. Deceased was an elder in the First Presbyterian church in Omaha. He was twice married. His second wife and six children survive.
