Elizabethtown Masonic Homes

Mt. Joy Choral Society, of 110 Voices Highly Pleases the Guests

That labor of love which is being so freely performed by the Masonic Lodges of Lancaster, Lebanon, Dauphin and York Counties, in providing the Sunday religious services for the Homes, has come to be to them not only a pleasant duty, but also has inspired enthusiasm and a spirit of emulation has sprung up between Sister Lodges, as to which can make their own the most beautiful and the most impressive. This has come to be recognized by the friends of the Homes, scattered over a large territory surrounding the Homes, and has resulted in attracting large audiences to these services.

On November 14, 1915, the services were held under the auspices of Mount Lebanon Lodge No. 226 of Lebanon, Pa. They were conducted by Rev. A. A. V. Bennington, rector of St. Luke's P. E. Church of Lebanon, and a member of Lodge No. 226. These services were beautified by the excellent singing of a male quartet.

Casiphia Lodge No. 551 of Mount Joy gained the thankful appreciation of the Homes in their offering of Sunday, November 21, 1915, in the Choral Society of Mount Joy, on which occasion an immense audience had the privilege and pleasure of listening for an hour and a half, to the gems of sacred music rendered in a masterly manner by 110 voices of this accomplished musical society, ably conducted by Bro. Dr. E. W. Garber.

night the season for all small game ended so that the woods will be left free to the hunters of deer, bears and raccoons. This is the result of changes brought about in the game laws in the last legislature, and which, it is believed, will result in less danger to hunters.

The season for quail, pheasants, rabbits, wild turkey and woodcock ended with November. The deer season will run from December 1 to 15, inclusive, one deer having horns two inches above the hair being allowed each hunter. The raccoon season will run to the end of the year, but the bear season will end with the deer season.

The black bass, rock bass and muscalogone season will end with November, but the salmon season will not close until the end of the year.

State officials are making efforts to secure co-operation of hunters and fishermen to prevent fire in forests and the pollution of streams. This year the damage done by forest fires has been smaller than usual. State reserves have not suffered as heavily as in former years.

Water is a necessity. The tiniest brooks up to the largest rivers play an important part in the scheme of things inasmuch as they are nature's way of

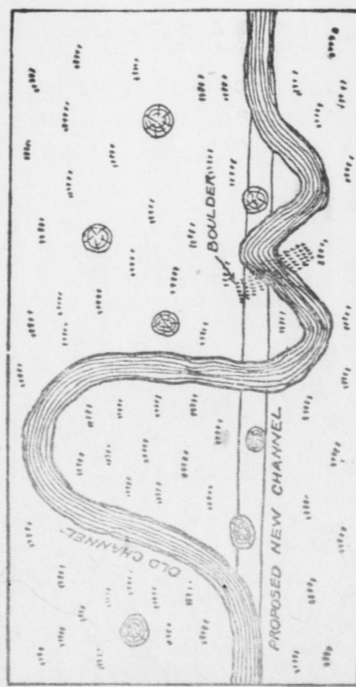


Diagram of Stream Troubles That May Be Corrected by Blasting.




