State Agricultural Notes
Lehigh county shows the largest potato production in the State with 1,142,470 bushels while Cameron has the smallest, of 21,645 bushels and Forest, 22,600 bushels. Seven counties in the State show an average yield of over 95 bushels to an acre in potato production. There has been an increase of over three per cent in the acreage sown to wheat this fall as compared with last year.

It is estimated that there are now 540 tractors in use on the farms in Pennsylvania. The average production of buckwheat to an acre this season is 16

bushels as compared with 1917. The Pennsylvania apple crop is estimated to be about eleven per cent larger than last year. Despite the high price of feed there are less hogs being fattened on Pennsylvania farms than last year. The high price of feed is a deterring factor. Estimates place the total production of alfalfa this season in the State at 138,600 tons.
