Hard by is the present Hossler's school and it is a model of architectural beauty. Large, roomy, well-lighted and ventilated, this building is regarded as one of the most improved in the township. Contrasted with the structure, that once served as the place of instruction for the neighborhood, it indicates the marvelous change that has taken place with in a century.

Hossler's school is now one of the most important in the township and being in a thickly settled section, the attendance is larger than at most other points. There are numerous well-kept farm houses in the district and a number of homes along the Mount Joy road. The teacher is Miss Ada Hook, of Columbia, a graduate of the Columbia High school, who is now teaching her second term. She has won favor with the patrons in the district, and is held in high esteem as a qualified and untiring teacher. Among her pupils are some boys and girls her pupils are some boys and girls whose ancestors, in years gone by, received their early instruction in the old log school house, which the present spacious and modernized building has replaced after many years. That old school is still one of the best brown landwarks of Raphe township. known landmarks of Rapho township.
