Elizabethtown, Jan. 13—Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Raffensberger, who reside on North Market street, received the following interesting letter from their daughter, Miss Elida Raffensberger, a nurse in the service of Uncle Sam overseas:

Dear Folks:— This on the Pacific Ocean. We are eight days out. The sea was wonderful at first but now we are just over a storm, one of the worst they had this year. In fact, one of the officers who has been in the worst storm he had ever been in. The waves came up so high that the water came into the smoke stacks. We had a fire down in the hold and the phosphorus ignited on top of the deck so we had a fire on top deck too. The ship rolled and rocked wonderfully. We were practically given up as lost. Everybody was frightened. It's really wonderful to see the sailors how religious they get. They are a very good set of boys on this boat. Well, I began to think I would never see Elizabethtown again, but then if it was my time to go, I guess I might as well make up my mind and do as all others do. For two days we were in great danger, never saw such waves. Mountains high. They struck the deck and knocked one down. Dishes were broken. I could not sit up for my meals. We were served sandwiches which tasted very good. Everybody on the boat has been wonderful to us. They all seem so anxious to please. Our food is very good (when they can cook it). I have a very nice state room. The remainder of my unit will come over later. Am so anxious to know where we will be stationed. This was a German boat. Its name now is the "Aelous" American transport. There are German pictures and paintings everywhere of German castles and noblemen. The boat rides very well. She makes sixteen knots an hour. We have a very heavy cargo. If it hadn't been for that I am sure we would have been lost. It was some experience, I assure you. Never want another just like it. The China sea had nothing on us those two days and with it all, I was only seasick one evening, and then not very bad. I didn't go to bed until 4 a. m. either night of the storm, though I would rather take a chance dressed than otherwise. Am so glad its all over for I am not likely to be in another as severe as that again. Most of the nurses are making their first trip. Am sure they will never forget it. Well, guess I have talked enough about storms, but that's all one can think of just now. Guess will walk home two years from now. ELIDIA.
